### You said - We did

- Speeding (34 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)). Between 01/05/2025 and 31/05/2025 the mobile speed camera visited the A47 four times, the B6047 four times, and the A6 twice and the A6003 once. More details on the police website.
- Anti social behaviour (21 votes on NHL) identifying individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Nuisance motorbikes (19 votes on NHL) We have been conducting uniformed and marked vehicle patrols in the areas you have told us this is a problem. We have directed officers to these areas in any down time they have to deter these offenders from causing problems in these areas.

#### **News**



This month, your local neighbourhood team have been working on intelligence regarding the cultivation of drugs in the Tilton on the Hill area. At 09:30 Tuesday 24th June, the local team supported by the neighbourhood priority team executed a magistrates misuse of drugs act warrant. This resulted in a large cannabis factory being located inside a specially designed outbuilding. Officers seized approximately £60,000 worth of cannabis.

Four people were arrested, interviewed and have been bailed pending further investigation.
