You Said	What we are doing
Road Safety - issues of parking illegally, speeding and other road safety matters	We continue to stop check and work with speed operators in your areas. Continued working with professionals with regard to illegal parking in Countesthorpe - Leicestershire County Council and Countesthorpe Parish Council. Reminder to the public not to keep valuables in their vehicles - vans or cars. Working on the Operation of Op Pedal-Fast to seize Electric Scooters. Continued patrolling in Countesthorpe, Foston and Kilby
Burglary	Households and businesses premises being broken into, because of insecure premises, opportunistic thieves who look for easy entry points or items visible to steal and signs that a property is not occupied. Working with the public, by giving safety advice to ensure that they do not get burgled or vehicles not broken into. Working with other professionals to give support to vulnerable people.
Anti-Social Behaviour	Ongoing work with neighbours over neighbourhood disputes, to ensure all parties have a happy workable resolution..

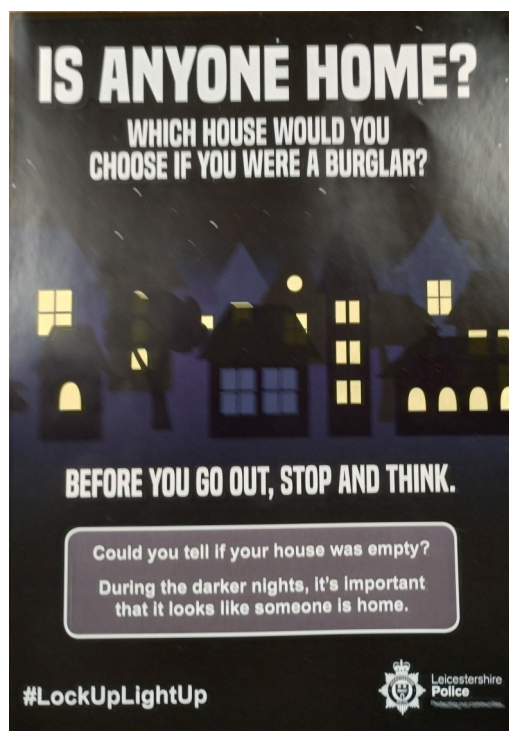
THE RAINBOW SHOP, COUNTESTHORPE

WHICH HOUSE WOULD YOU CHOOSE IF YOU WERE A BURGLAR?



- Use automatic timer switches to turn lights on when it gets dark.
- Keep doors and windows locked at all times, even when you're home and take the key out of the lock.
- Keep keys, cash and valuables out of sight.
- Take the time to check your alarm system and that all outside bulbs and security lighting is in full working order.
- Prevent easy access to the back and sides of your home with locked gates or fencing.

- Don't advertise on social media or tell anyone that you don't trust.
