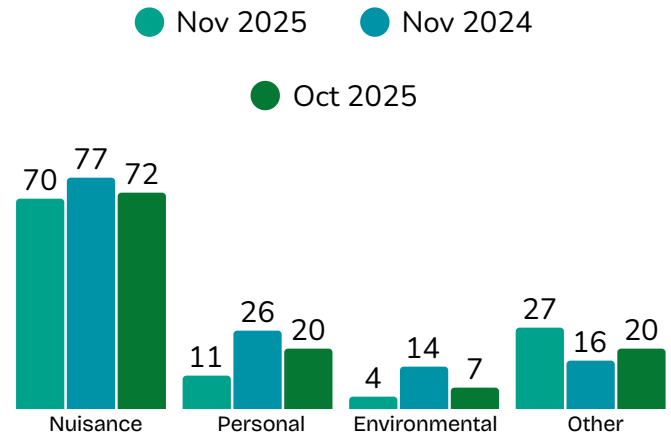
Incidents in Nov 2024

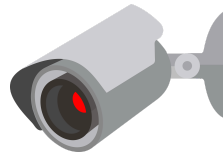

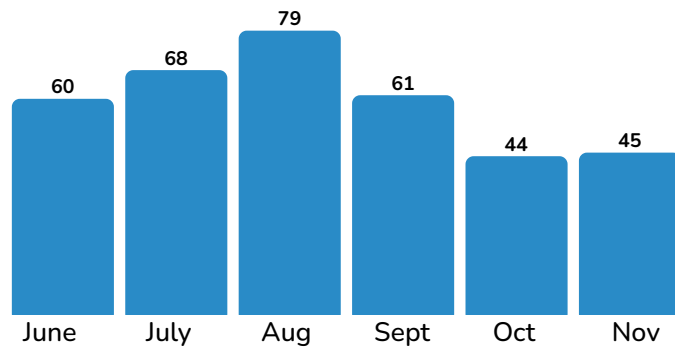
CCTV

During November **45** Incidents within the Vale of Glamorgan were captured on CCTV.

The CCTV cameras are assisting Police and the Local Authority with their investigations, the highest incidents were;



- Aggressive / Violent Behaviour**
- Concern for Welfare**
- Vehicle Incident**
- Missing Person**
- Theft**



The Vale of Glamorgan Council entered a partnership with Cardiff Council and South Wales Police to maximise the effectiveness of CCTV monitoring across the region. The CCTV cameras are monitored 24/7 in Cardiff Council by CCTV trained operators.

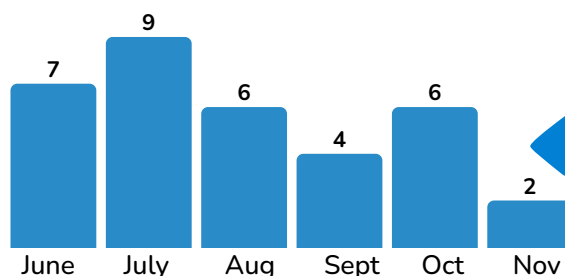
Community Cohesion

Community Engagement



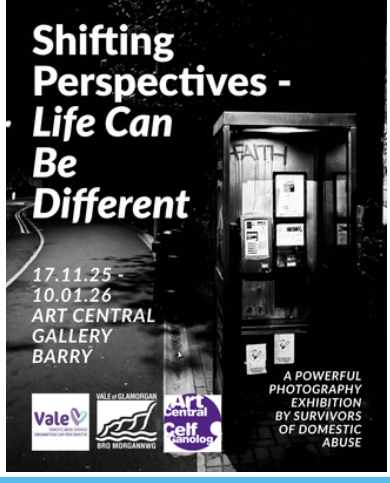

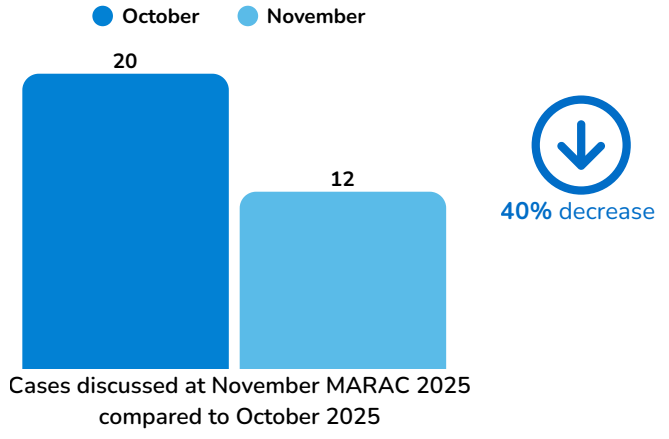
The exhibition will be open to the public until 10 January 2026, offering an opportunity to engage with these inspiring stories.



MARAC (Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference)

The weekly MARAC involves all key partners and stakeholders working together to create an action plan for Domestic Violence victims and their families.

-  **100%** of cases discussed were female victims.
-  **83%** of cases discussed involved children being present during the incident.
-  **50%** of victims were engaging with support services.

Target Hardening

Target Hardening is where we install extra security such as CCTV, burglar alarms, new door or window locks if it enables a victim of domestic abuse to remain in their home safely.
