### What matters to you

You told us these 3 issues are most important to you:

#### 1. Drug Dealing

What we're doing: This month the beat team have been speaking with residents to gather further intelligence, and have distributed letters encouraging people to come forward and speak to us. Work is also underway to secure a closure order on a property linked to suspected drug activity.

#### 2. Shoplifting

What we're doing: This month the beat team have conducted High-Visibility Patrols maintaining a strong presence in known hot spot areas to deter offenders and reassure local businesses. We've met with store managers and security teams to share intelligence, offer crime prevention advice, and encourage consistent incident reporting, and when able, officers have parked outside stores while conducting clerical tasks, providing a visible deterrent to potential offenders.

#### 3. Road Safety and Speeding

What we're doing: This month, we've conducted Speed checks along Shepshed Road, Hathern. Collating traffic data which will be shared with the LLR Road Safety Partnership. For consideration of including the location for Camera Van Enforcement. PCSO Bailey has also supported a Fatal 4 operation with the Road Safety Unit, targeting key driving offences.

### **Community Engagement**

The team conduct regular beat surgeries at various venues across the beat area to engage with the community, address concerns, and provide support.
