What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are going to do: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are going to do: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorist's speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are going to do: Your local police beat team and response officers have regularly patrolled identified anti-social behaviour locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

Burglary

With temperatures remaining warm, occupants are still leaving their windows open. It is important no matter how long you leave your house unattended for, please ensure that all windows are locked. Don't take the risk, as this increases the opportunity for burglars and you becoming a victim. Local officers continue to conduct preventative patrols and gather information on suspect vehicles. In addition, the Oadby Police Team held a meeting to discuss proposed work in preventing burglaries. As a result, we have identified locations where we will be holding crime prevention events, more information will be released in due course.



Anti-social behaviour

There have been patrols carried out by local officers in relation to anti-social behaviour involving vehicles at key locations in the area. As a result of patrols, we have gathered information on these vehicles and identified individuals responsible for causing the issues. The Oadby team have also been busy dealing with ongoing neighbour problems, work has been done with Oadby Wigston Borough Council and housing associations on a partnership basis in resolving the issues.

Speed Gun Training

Local officers will receive training in using the dedicated speed gun which is located at Wigston. This will enable PCSOs and police officers to target speeding drivers. The speed gun itself is a useful tool which will also assist in making sure our roads are safer.



Oadby Motor Fest

PCSO Nad attended this year's Oadby Motor Fest held on Sunday 11th August 2024, this is an annual event which brings the Oadby community together. With the weather being hot, this attracted many residents to visit the event. It was great to meet the community and familiar faces.
