Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you.

You Said	We did
E-scooters are being used to cause anti-social behaviour in Earl Shilton, by riding on the pedestrian footpaths.	Patrols have been conducted regularly and we're pleased to say with very little e-scooter activity observed. We are sure this issue has not gone away and we will continue to monitor.
Motorcross bikes are being used in an anti-social manner around the areas of Mill Lane and the Quarry.	Officers have increased patrols in identified hotspot locations, particularly during peak times when incidents are reported. We have gathered and reviewed intelligence from community reports, CCTV and other available evidence to identify offenders. Officers have issued warning letters, Section 59 notices (where appropriate), and other enforcement powers against riders involved in anti-social use of vehicles.
Youths are acting in an anti-social manner on Wood Street Park, with reports of them drinking, fighting, setting fires, and causing damage to fences.	Patrols were conducted in the Wood Street Park area, where officers engaged with a group of youths. Through this engagement, it was established that they were the individuals entering the Ivydence Close Care Home. Strong words of advice were given regarding their behaviour and all relevant details were obtained. The youths' names have been added to ECINS for intelligence purposes. This was a positive engagement with a really good outcome, as those involved were identified and appropriately addressed.

News

Patrols in Shilton-By-The-Sea. Over the three days of this event, PCSO 6665 has been carrying out dedicated patrols in and around Shilton-by-the-Sea, spending time in key areas of the community, speaking with residents, businesses, and visitors. It has been fantastic to see so many members of the public taking the time to stop and chat, raise concerns, share local information, and simply say hello. The level of community engagement has been amazing and demonstrates the strong relationship between local policing and the people we serve. Thank you to everyone who approached me during these patrols. Your feedback, intelligence, and support are invaluable in helping us keep Shilton-by-the-Sea a safe and welcoming place for everyone.



Officers from the Hinckley and Burbage Beat Teams, alongside the Rural Crime Team, worked in partnership with Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council and the Environment Agency to assist with a large-scale illegal waste tipping incident. During the operation, a pickup truck and a JCB were recovered from the site under local authority powers, as they are suspected of being linked to waste crime. Illegal waste dumping can have a significant impact on our communities,

countryside, and environment. We remain committed to working with our partner agencies to tackle those responsible and protect our local area. Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council is appealing for information in relation to this incident. We recently highlighted an increase in burglaries and vehicle thefts across the Hinckley area. A thorough investigation was launched by our Neighbourhood Priority Team, supported by local officers. As a result of this work, four people were arrested in connection with the offending. Following extensive enquiries, two individuals have now been charged with more than 40 offences relating to 27 separate crimes committed across the Hinckley area during the last three weeks. The two defendants appeared at Leicester Magistrates' Court and have been remanded in custody until the end of September. This is a significant result and I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Neighbourhood Priority Team, the local officers who supported the investigation and the victims and witnesses whose information and cooperation were invaluable in bringing these offenders before the courts. Further enforcement activity will continue as we identify and pursue any additional offenders linked to this crime series.
