Over the past month we have received reports (as you can see inside this newsletter) of Two Males in a vehicle, pulling up alongside a youth who is walking at the time and trying to engage with them.

Both reported issues have occurred within the LEFTWICH AREA, but this could happen in other areas.

In both reported issues:

- there was one young male walking on a footpath
- Car pulls up (with two males inside) and window goes down
- One reported issues—they ask
 - -"where are you going?"
 - "what are you doing?"
- In the second reported issued—They told the youth to "get in the car"

Both incidents the youths refused to speak to them and went home and told their parents.


Unfortunately there was no vehicle details so we have no lines of enquiry as of yet in regards to this

WE CAN NOT ACT—IF WE DON'T KNOW

On patrols PCSO ROBERTSON has been alerted to issues that are occurring within the community.

- Speeding vehicles entering BUTCHERS STILE
- Issues surrounding the new childrens play area in the ROSE MEADOW estate

All of these have been mentioned to PCSO ROBERTSON, but when looking back at reports that have been , none of the above have been reported to 101.

WHO TO CALL.

All reports should be made in the following ways: 101—non emergencies

999—emergencies only

Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111

Issues or concerns through the residents voice survey

Reports should NOT be made via:

- via our social media page—NORTHWICH SOUTH (as it is not monitored)
- To PCSO ROBERTSON mobile number (as there times when he is off duty)

Reports should be made to the official numbers so officers that are on duty at the time of report can deal with them (if available)

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Arguing and a potential fight could occur due to the DVLA clamping vehicles in the area. This is happening in the communal car park
- Fight between 4 girls (3 on 1 incident). The fight was broken up by the reporting person and spoken to the mother of the girl who was attacked and advised to repoirt to 101—There has been no further reports in regards to the victim, Police CAN NOT act if there is no Victim report. PCSO ROBERTSON will speak to reporting person in regards to this and patrols will occur in area due to a rise in reports
- There is constant barking from Neighbours dogs which is very unsual— OFFICERS
 attended and spoke to the owner of the Dogs, to which he stated that he stayed
 out late. There was no issues with Owner or the dogs
- Neighbours shouting at reporting person due to visitors parking in the residents only area—PCSO ROBERTSON is dealing with this due to a previous report.
- Unknown female banging on reporting persons door being upset, there may be alcohol involved —**PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit**
- Young child shouting abuse on the new play park—PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a
 home visit and speak to the reporting person to get more details of who this
 could be
- 2 reports of Male passed out on ARTISAN WAY possibly due to Alcohol, reporting
 person has spoken to them and he says hes ok—Not a police issues, AMBULANCE
 ISSUE—Right care, Right Person
- Male banging on a door and trying to get in , throwing items around—RESPONSE officers dispatched and male was taken to hosipital . PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit to reporting person
- Concern about a friend who the reporting person has lost contact with and is saying they are going to hurt themselves—Further call to say friend has been located

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

- 2 reports regarding DVLA had clamped a vehicle and the owner of the car is angle grinding the clamp off.— Has been crimed and RESPONSE OFFICERS Dispatched— DVLA was contacted and the vehicle was recovered as it had NO TAX
- Male spotted smashing up the BUS STOP opposite the art college—MALE ARRESTED



LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- MALE heard shouting and causing a huge disturbance—RESPONSE OFFICERS have attended the address and spoke to the MALE who was having an argument on his phone. All is safe and well
- Neighbour was seen filming reporting person in back garden having drinks with friends— PCSO ROBERTSON has already spoken to the neighbour in regards to this as its an ongoing issue. He will also conduct a reassurance visit to the reporting person and speak with WEAVER VALE.
- Concern over a female who has not been in contact or seen for a week—this is a RIGHT CARE RIGHT PERSON deployment—therefore RESPONSE OFFICERS not deployed
- Drunken underage female with no parents around—left in care of ambulance
- Male was allowed to stay at reporting persons property for a couple of days, but now
 is not leaving the property— No offences therefore no deployment as person was
 allowed to stay in the first place Further reports that there is screaming and
 shouting from the address—officers attended and spoke to all parties
- Neighbour shouted at reporting person and made them feel scared—RESPONSE
 OFFICERS attended the address and reporting person was the one shouting at the officers. Refused to speak about what she reported.
- Ongoing issue at a premises relating to ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR— PCSO
 ROBERTSON and WEAVER VALE are working together in relation to this
- Neighbour sprayed water over reporting person and his BBQ— PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit, ongoing neighbour issues which are being looked at.
- Friends questioning the age gap of a non sexual relationship of the reporting person—
 this has been alerted to the community policing team
- The LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING has been breached again as fences down—
 Councillor has been notified so therefore fences should be fixed soon
- Ongoing neighbour issues, as neighbour is burning rubbish as soon as clothes by reporting person are being placed out, therefore antagonizing them—PCSO ROBERTSON has already spoke to one of the parties, will speak to other and advise further issues from any party will result in action being taken
- Further reports in regards to the Neighbour issue—PCSO ROBERTSON and PC BOX will advise all parties to leave each other alone, and further action will be taken, not had time to attend as of yet
- Group of youths hanging around the shop area, and a male has threatened to KILL THEM—no further reports in regards to youths and no location / description of this male—CLIFTON DRIVE is on the PCSO Patrol Plan as ASB hotspot
- Concern over a mother who has left the house after an argument and is feeling low—
 RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched and mother located and back safe and well, and there was no intention of hurting herself
- Male on a off road bike with another male, driving dangerously in a 20 mph road—
 RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched—no trace of the vehicle. On patrol plan as we have been given details of who this is, but to act and get bike seized—this needs to be witnessed by officers

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- White SUV doing donuts and wheel spins on the GREEN by ELLESMERE ROAD Vehicle had left the area after the call was made, therefore was advised to call b
 ack if it returns—PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit
- Group of youths in the area of CLIFTON DRIVE shops and kicking another youth who is on the floor—
- 2nd report by the offender to explain what had occurred— Issue of youth chasing another youth and causing them issues. Somone stepped in and defended the person who was getting abused, which was witnessed by the first reporting person. This has been passed to the criming team. PCSO ROBERTSON is conducting patrols around CLIFTON DRIVE and any youths in area will be questioned and moved on if required to
- 4 year old found walking on CLIFTON DRIVE at 6am—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched and VPA submitted in regards to the 4 year old
- Vehicle with 2 Asian males stopped by reporting persons son, as he was walking on FAIRFIELD and started to ask questions— RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched and spoke to the reporting person and son. There was an incident in the area, in which this may be the reason why there were questions being asked (being nosey) there was no vehicle details, so therefore no way of finding out who had done this. Safeguarding advice given. PCSO ROBERTSON will also conduct a reassurance visit.
- Another report in regards to two Asian males stopping the car and asking reporting
 persons son to GET IN THE CAR. Son replied No and kept head down. This occurred on
 another day No vehicle details, uncertain that this is the same vehicle with
 same males. OFFICERS made aware and social media post has gone out.
- Issue of possibly identify theft due to receiving a phone call from police and driving license being lost—PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit
- Male shouting abuse on the field at reporting persons wife, he is making no sense at all—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched—search made no trace. PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit

THEFT

- Reporting person has had a friend stay with them and items have gone missing—
 Officers will be looking into this
- Neighbour stealing reporting persons plants—CRIMED—PCSO ROBERTSON will also conduct a reassurance visit in regard to this
- Phone was left on a bus. Therefore reporting person waited for the bus to return, and when it did the phone was not there and was not handed in.—CRIMED—officers are looking into this and speaking with the bus company

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Large number of youths causing damage to the play area in OLD HALL PLAY PARK—
 PCSO ROBERTSON has been alerted to this via NORTHWICH TOWN COUNCIL and therefore CCTV has been requested so the identification process can begin

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Male and Female youths smashing bottles and shouting slurs at people who are
 passing by—PCSO ROBERTSON may know who this is due to description. He will
 speak to the reporting person to find out the location this occurred and then if it
 is the male he knows, a home address will be made.
- Reporting persons daughter was grabbed by a older MALE in MOULTON PARK—PCSO ROBERTSON will get in touch with MOULTON PARISH COUNCIL to view CCTV and speak to REPORTING PERSON
- Fight happening outside the KINGFISHER—RESPONSE officers dispatched and no fight on arrival
- Concern over a female due to the fact that she just received bad news from someone, and then called them back to say—She wants to end it all—RIGHT CARE RIGHT
 PLACE—AMBULANCE should be notified for this
- Concern over the possibility that someone may have died due to a strong smell, but unsure where its coming from. Reporting person had just dropped off relative and can not ask that relative to knock on the addresses they think this smell is coming from—

 No deployment unless further calls
- Neighbour shouting abuse and possibly leaving notes—PCSO ROPBERTSON will contact the reporting person in regards to this for more of a background
- YOUTHS riding on reporting person garden—PC COLLICT attended and there was no sign of the youths and spoke to the Reporting Person. PCSO ROBERTSON will contact Reporting person when back in the community
- Two males fishing in the pond on CORONET AVENUE—PCSO ROBERTSON will
 conduct patrols around the area of the time the report as been made. And will
 conduct a home visit to the reporting person
- YOUTHS throwing sticks over the fence and shouting abusive language—PCSO
 ROBERTSON will conduct patrols in and around the area at time stated on the report
- Number of people on the grass area opposite KINGFISHER making noise at 3am, reporting person has not seen them but have been making noise for 30mins—No other reports in regards to this—NOISE ISSUE but PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct reassurance visit

FRAUD

 An ONLINE ACCOUNT being hacked and purchases being made.— Safeguarding advice given and PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit

SHOPLIFTING

- Male has walked out with basket full of meat at TESCO KINGSMEAD—CCTV will be requested
- Two male youths ran out of store with a crate of beer—CCTV will checked and requested

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

 Number of youths starting a fire near the primary school — Advised by called that the youths ran off, no description of them, so therefore no deployment

DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Concern over a male due to the fact there was arrangements made and have not heard from them, seen them and cant get in contact—**Safeguarding advice—Right care right person.**
- Suspicious people in a car and a dog, parking up in WILDINGS GROVE and acting odd— RESPONSE officers dispatched—SEARCH MADE NO TRACE of the vehicle and persons

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

Tree branch sticking out in the road on the bend by SHIPBROOK ROAD —**Highways** Notified

MOULTON

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- New owner of a property has attended their address and was told by neighbours that a
 MALE was entering the outhouse that is at the rear of the property—RESPONSE
 OFFICERS have spoken to the reporting person, there has been nothing taken and
 safeguarding has been provided (Outhouse should be made secure). PCSO
 ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit.
- Neighbour causing a disturbance by banging on walls and noise—Advice given as this is a noise issue. PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a reassurance visit.
- Male being heard saying he doesn't know where he is—there is no need for police deployment
- Reporting persons grandson is receiving threatening messages, which also includes themselves—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched and spoke to reporting person, there are no direct threats made, and victim wont show messages to officers.
 PCSO ROBERTSON will conduct a Reassurance visit.

MINI POLICE SUMMER

What is the MINI POLICE SUMMER?

With schools closing for the summer, NORTHWICH POLICE use to provide community events for youths of the community to attend. This was in partnership with our partners who helped arranged and put on these events. However over time these community events became utilized by other areas, funding was not available or attendance for the events was low which

lead to event getting cancelled.

So we brought the Mini Police program into the summer community event schedule and carried on what the Mini Police were doing at school, over the course of the summer. Which lead to 4 MINI POLICE COURT sessions being held and the popular TACTICAL TRAINING DAY at CHESHIRE HEADQUARTERS.

This was open to any Mini Police officer from the community, past and present from Davenham, Hartford, Kingsmead and Rudheath

MINI POLICE TACKLE SPEEDING.

One of the main aspects of the MINI POLICE SUMMER was MINI POLICE COURT. This is where the Mini Police were working with the local policing team to tackle speeding.

Officers were on CHESTER WAY with the Speed
Gun and if any driver was caught travelling over the 30MPH (which was the speed limit) they were

Take the ticket together with Fine and Points or attend Mini Police Court and get interviewed by the Mini Police about why they were speeding.

pulled over by officers and given a choice.

Over the course of the month a total of 31 drivers were interviewed by the Mini Police. Feedback from the people attending, include "That was terrifing" "Ive learnt my lesson today" "that was worse that what I thought it would be".







TACTICAL TRAINING UNIT

One of the events that was carried over from last year was the popular Tactical Training unit day. Which was held at Cheshire Constabulary HQ. The unit was opened up to the Mini Police to learn about other types of patrols that police can do.

The unit is vital in the training of all Police Officers who join Cheshire Constabulary, or as part of their yearly refresher courses.

Last year there was a maximum of 10
Mini Police, this year that was increased
in which we had 20 giving up their summer to learn about policing.

At the Training Unit, the Mini Police learnt:

- Riot Shield Training
- patrolling in a team
- how to patrol as part of a team with riot sheilds
- how to protect the team when debris is being thrown
- how police enter properties, force of entry
- how to conduct a search in a property
- Riot Gear uniform
- Helping someone who is trapped in water

And then putting everything that they learnt together to conduct an warrant ,searching and arresting someone (PCSO ROBERTSON) within a building.
