Proactive stops are taking place regularly to take dangerous vehicles off the road and protect local drivers. Vehicles used in crime remain a focus point and continue to be targeted.

By promoting safer roads and reinforcing responsible driving habits, speed checks play an essential role in keeping neighbourhoods safer and more reassuring for everyone who lives, walks, or travels through the area.
