Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
ASB – Ongoing issues with large groups of youths, gathering in large numbers being loud and abusive, playing loud music, fighting, and causing damage particularly in Crescent, Argents Mead, and Castle Street.	Our Officers are addressing reports of anti-social behaviour by including initiatives such as targeted patrols around key areas. As the school summer holidays are due to start these will be increased and with more hot weather we would urge parents to educate your children in safety around water.
Due to the make-up of the town centre and the volume of retail premises there is an on-going problem with shop theft. Ongoing issues with known offenders committing shop thefts in town, using threat of violence and abuse towards staff. Impacting on small businesses suffering with monetary loss.	Officers are regularly patrolling the Town Centre and support staff together with the amazing staff who operate the CCTV in the Town. See below for more details.
The nightlife scene in Hinckley can lead to offences being committed, some of which are offences of violence such as assaults.	Every Friday and Saturday night we have dedicated officers patrolling the streets of Hinckley town centre, this is known as night time economy.

News

PCSO 6593 Needham and PCSO 6651 Pugh had a fantastic time attending the Clarendon Park Fair in Hinckley. It was great to meet so many members of the local community, chat with residents, answer questions, and engage with families enjoying the event. Community events like these provide a valuable opportunity for us to strengthen relationships, listen to local concerns, and promote safety awareness in a relaxed and friendly environment. Thank you to everyone who stopped by to say hello. We are proud to serve our community and look forward to attending more local events in the future.

During one shift BOOTS, in the Britannia Centre, Hinckley informed local officers that there had been a theft of several items to the value of

£1453. The male was detained in the location of Church Walk, Hinckley whereby several items had been located in a bag for life held by the suspect. The perfumes were 60ml fragrances £140 per item. All products were removed from the bag and the items as a collective had been taken back to the store. The male was issued a ban from Hinckley Town Centre (16-week period), given an exclusion map and was also referred to Turning Point for additional support.

You told us that ASB was a priority in your area, this past month Officers and PCSO's have attended an old factory on Wood Street which is currently being demolished, youths have entered the premises and prior to our arrival the youths had left, with the school holidays starting soon we would urge parents to talk to your children about the dangers of the site. Officers were patrolling an area in Hinckley Town Centre, specifically in the underground car park of Sainsburys. After witnessing some suspicious behaviour two males were detained and searched under section 23 of the misuse of drugs act. One male was found to be in possession of cannabis. The drugs were seized, due to his age his parents were contacted and a referral to the Youth Offending Service was completed.
