Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 29th March 2026

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Ready for the road?

With spring finally on the horizon, many riders are bringing their motorbikes out of hibernation.

Before you hit the road, a few simple safety checks can make sure your bike is performing at its best and help you enjoy a smooth, safe ride.

- Check tyre pressure and tread.
- Check your lights and brakes are all working correctly.
- Check your oil and fuel.

It may sound obvious to always ride to the road and weather conditions, but prolonged periods of wet weather have badly affected a lot of road surfaces – yes, we mean potholes! And even though the temperatures are rising, frost and ice can linger well into May.

After a winter off the bike, your skills and reactions may need a little warming up too. So, start slowly, ride your own ride and if you want a refresher or to improve your skills and enjoyment, there are some fantastic courses available:

Inspector Wayne Boulton said “We know from our statistics that drivers or riders failing to judge another person’s path or speed and failing to look properly are major causes of collisions involving motorcyclists. That’s why we are also asking drivers to look at least twice for motorcyclists especially at junctions where most collisions occur.”

Faster responses for our communities

How we respond to you in an emergency is one of the most important things for a police force to get right.

We're committed to getting there fast when you most need us, and we've been making significant improvements in the last year.

So, what can you expect if you need to call us in an emergency?

We answer almost all (94%) emergency calls in ten seconds.

It usually takes about 12 minutes to reach you, and we get to the vast majority (85%) within 20 minutes.

Where something's happened but it isn't an emergency, we set a two-hour target response time.

We use a risk assessment process to work out how quickly we need to reach you.

It usually takes us just over 33 minutes to get to you and we'll be there within the target time in almost all of these incidents (93%).
