You Said	We did
Burglaries including residential and commercial property.	We will aim to provide a robust response to burglaries and enhance security with vulnerable properties. In the past 28 days we have had no burglaries reported.
General anti-social behaviour, congregating children causing issues, e-bikes and e-scooters, motorbikes	We will aim to provide high visibility patrols within hotspot areas to reduce the occurrences of anti-social behaviour.
Issues around parking illegally, speeding and other road safety matters.	We will aim to complete high visibility patrols and deal with any traffic infringements including completing speed checks.

News

We have had two reports, about school parents parking on the pavements outside the Kilby Primary School on the Main Street in Kilby at school time. Your local pub has offered for you to park at their premises,. Please take this up. When cars are blocking the pavements, children are not able to walk safely with their families, even when crossing the road, they are not able to see past the cars.

PC Jodie has been supporting our traffic and firearms colleagues using HOSTYDS (a specialist trained method to safely stop and contain vehicles linked to serious crime). As a trained officer using HOSTYDS we can be deployed to assist our colleagues. A vehicle was boxed in and four people were detained and arrested for numerous offences. A nice long trip to custody for the group.

A car decided it would be a great idea to try some race track style driving, going well above the speed limit. Unfortunately for them they didn't see us catching him up in the distance, safe to say the driver was very apologetic. Some stern words were given and the driver was dealt with at the scene for their manner of driving.

During 1 particular shift we had a lot of clerical work and catching up on crime allocations on our beat area, and ensuring victims are being updated. The first blue light of the shift was to assist PC Chris and PC Jayce on a stop check, where 3 persons were detained and stop searched following a recent theft..... jackpot.... all stolen items were recovered and all 3 dealt with after some identity checks at the scene using our fingerprint scanner device.

We also had a Grade 1 High Risk missing gentleman with dementia who had left the beat area on foot and hadn't been seen for a couple hours. Luckily after searches, and a call from a member of the public, the male was safely located and returned to his family. Thank you to all who helped in the search.
