Anti-Social Behaviour - 1. Ongoing issues with large groups of youths, particularly on public parks and open spaces, fighting, playing loud music, being abusive, drinking and using drugs. 2. Use of vehicle driving erratically and having noisy exhaust and revving the engines.	Reports of vehicles doing doughnuts on Wykin Road in Hinckley and motorcyclists speeding, vehicles had left prior to attendance but we'd urge anyone with vehicle license plates to please get in touch.
Reports of drug dealing and using at a number of addresses on the beat, with high interest to the rest of the county and other counties. This is attracting undesirables to the location and often resulting in ASB and disorder at the addresses.	Intelligence is being developed by local officers
Speeding of vehicles along a number of roads on the beat, breaches of weight restrictions and bridge strikes all lead to a feeling amongst the community that road safety is an issue. Along with multiple parking issues in regards to school times and busy roads Users driving with no documents such as Insurance, MOT and Tax. With no licenses.	As part of Op Flux traffic, vehicles have been recovered for no tax, insurance or drug driving.

News

The cash machine located at Asda, Barwell Lane, Hinckley was where our very own Sgt Alex and PC Jack swooped in like Ninjas and arrested two males for ATM skimming before they even knew they were there. They were in custody for the majority of the day, with one of them wanted for numerous similar thefts over 4 different counties! We've had West Midlands complete searches of the arrested person's addresses, Avon & Somerset come to Leicestershire to interview for their offences and our friends at West Mercia then collected to interview at their station, and currently building the file for all involved forces for a remand overnight to court in the morning. Great teamwork from multiple Hinckley shifts, custody, the other forces, and the Asda staff and security team.



We have unfortunately seen an increase in the theft of motor vehicles, 4 BMW's were stolen in the first week of the month in the area however, traffic officers on nights spotted a suspicious vehicle that had been linked by intelligence to one of the thefts. With support from our colleagues in Warwickshire we managed to stop the vehicle and arrested the occupant. In addition, we also caught up with a stolen BMW and again the driver was arrested.

An appeal is being made for motorists with dashcam footage to come forward following a serious collision in Hinckley. Police were called to the B4667 Ashby Road, close to the junction with Elizabeth Road, just after 2pm on Friday (13 June). The vehicles involved were a grey Jaguar F-Pace and a red and white Honda CBR motorcycle. The rider of the motorcycle, a man in his 20s, was taken to hospital where he is continuing to receive treatment. No arrests were made. PC Ellise Timmins, from the force's Serious Collision Investigation Unit (SCIU), said: "Our enquiries into the circumstances of this incident are continuing and I'd like to speak to anyone who can help. "I'm particularly keen to speak to any motorists with a dashcam or who saw the collision occur. Anything you can tell us could help our investigation."
