In October 2025, a total of 49 incidents were recorded across several categories. The highest number of incidents fell under Violence Against the Person, with 16 reports, making it the most common category for the month. This was followed by Theft with 7 incidents, and Vehicle Offences, which accounted for 5 reports. Other reported categories included Burglary (3), Arson and Criminal Damage (3), non-notifiable offences (3), non-crime incidents (9), Public Order Offences (2), and Drug Offences (1). Overall, the month showed a varied crime profile, with violent offences notably standing out as the most frequent.

Burglary/Attempted burglary

Burglary Residential:

Connaught Gardens – On 2nd October 3 males have broken the front window to the address and unlocked the front door. 3 males have entered and heard victim upstairs then exited through the front door.

Dorchester Avenue - Burglary whereby suspects smashed rear glass door, conducted untidy search and left through front door and left in unknown getaway car parked down the road. Incident happened on 3rd October.

The Larches - Burglary of a dwelling on 10th October, where a vehicle and Play station has been taken. 2 males entered the property via a ground floor rear window and left via back door from the kitchen.

Theft:

Other theft:

Barrow Close – On 15th October theft in a dwelling reported. Male suspect known to the informant has taken items belonging to the informant and caused damage inside the property belonging to her.

New Park Avenue – On 21st October recycling bin left outside property has been stolen by unknown suspect.

Madeira Road – On 20th October bin has been stolen from outside the property.

Theft person:

Madeira Road – On 6th October victim was walking home using her phone, when a moped passed by, turned around, and snatched her phone.

Hedge Lane – On 13th October victim was on the phone when suspect on scooter came past and snatched it from the victim.

The Larches – On 17th October the caller stated that a moped of an unknown colour, make, model or VRM had snatched his phone.

Theft from motor vehicle:

Farndale Avenue - on 18th October wallet containing victim's bank cards and driving licence had been stolen from vehicle.

Theft of motor vehicle:

Farndale Avenue - The customer had the vehicle on a long-term hire (3x months) and advised they would be returning the vehicle on Tuesday 7th October due to lack of funds. The vehicle still fails to be returned, with no monies actioned to remain the vehicle on hire. The customer failed to return the vehicle on the 7th October, he then advised the vehicle would be back by 15:00 on Wednesday 8th October. The vehicle was not returned on this date.

Vehicle Interference:

Ash Grove – attempted car robbery on 11th October

The Larches – On 3rd and 15th October unknown suspect (appears to be the same man on both occasions) attempted to get into both victim's cars on the drive.

Ash Grove – On 17th October overnight unknown suspect(s) has gained access into informant motor vehicle and conducted an untidy search.



Protect your electronic keys

- Thieves are using equipment to scan for electronic keys and create a blank key that they can then be used to steal vehicles.
- Keep your electronic key in a security pouch, which prevents thieves from scanning your key and stealing your vehicle.

Don't make it easy for them

- Always double check your windows and doors are closed and locked every time you leave your vehicle, even if you're only gone for a few minutes. Thieves will often try door handles on the off chance that they are unlocked.
- Set the steering lock if your vehicle is fitted with one. If not, use an individual bar type steering lock.
- Consider using a gear stick lock.
- Thieves will often burgle houses to steal vehicle keys. Keep yours safe and avoid obvious storage places such as hallways and kitchens.
- If you don't have one, consider fitting a tracking device to your vehicle to help recover it if stolen.

Parking

- If you have a garage at home, use it. If you don't, try to park in a well-lit open place.
- Use public car parks that are part of the police approved 'Park Mark' Safer Parking Scheme.

Criminal damage:

Hedge Lane – On 2nd October criminal damage to a vehicle was reported. Female boxed in by suspect who has jumped out his vehicle, smashed a brick against her windscreen causing damage, whilst holding a machete causing fear and tried to assault victims' family.

Rookby Court – On 11th October suspect sprayed painted "perv out" on victim wall.

Hedge Lane – On 21st October criminal damage to a dwelling where value of that damage is under £500 reported.

Drugs:

Harington Terrace – On 9th October cannabis was found on the suspect during search following initial arrest.
