Roles – Main Coordinator



What is the role of a Main Coordinator?

The role of a Main Coordinator is one which is extremely rewarding and important for your community, as it means that you are the main contact for the scheme/group for members and partners to connect with and are responsible for cascading information to them.

Neighbourhood Watch is about building and strengthening a community's resilience to reduce opportunity, build confidence to report and raise awareness of crime. This is done through creating a community network of neighbours, partners (local authority, police, schools) and groups who look out for each other in a positive and welcoming environment.

The role includes:

| Participate in Ward/ Safer Neighbourhood panels to support local police and other agencies to identify local issues and solve problems where there are community concerns | Promote neighbourliness by encouraging members to keep an eye on each other's homes and possessions, giving special consideration to supporting vulnerable neighbours. |
| Encourage members to report suspicious activity, antisocial behaviour and incidents to police and local authorities | Ensure that following approval, your scheme is registered through our website <u>www.ourwatch.org.uk</u> and membership and scheme information is kept up to date. |
| Promote personal responsibility for community safety by sharing <u>crime prevention information</u> and encouraging members to improve their home, on- line and personal security. | Hold community events – such as <u>street parties</u> , picnics, sports day, community safety events, <u>listening events</u> etc |

As a scheme coordinator, you may wish to do more and arrange events or other local activities to bring your neighbours together and help tackle local issues of concern to them. How much more you do is dependent upon the time and commitment you are prepared to give.
