



Warden Monthly Report

June 2026 – Pulborough Parish



This month we walked around 102 miles on foot patrol 😊

Pulborough Village Market

It was lovely to see some of you at the village market and have a chat about all things 'Pulborough' 😊

Vulnerable People

We supported a resident who was having issues with a neighbour. This was deemed to be public order so we signposted to the Police.

We worked with a resident regarding a possible banking scam phone call and gave advice.

We've helped a resident who is concerned regarding alleged harassing behaviour from their neighbour.

We also had a phone call with a resident regarding serious concerns for a neighbour needing care.

We worked with a resident who had some care needs and helped put a care package in place for them. We also gave benefits guidance and advice to help them with their needs.

A resident came to us in need of a bed for a family member. We spoke to the Wholesome Warehouse and Horsham Matters to see if they can help. They will contact the resident when they have one.

We came across a resident who was looking for dementia groups and cafes to join. We told them about the various groups in the village and also suggested they contact their GP as they had concerns they had dementia themselves.

We continue to keep an eye out on a property that is empty following the resident going into a care home. This has been for some time now. The neighbours are looking after the outside and we've also contacted our Empty Homes Team to see how and if they can help. This is ongoing.

There was someone camping in a tent on the cinder path by the train station. They were very vulnerable with a complex situation and our homeless outreach team got involved to offer support. We also kept an eye out and did litter picks of the area. We had a large amount of residents contact us re this and advised we were supporting the male, despite them saying we should just remove the tent (which we can't just do). Our homeless team were going to remove it on 26th June and store it (as it is his property) but someone decided to set fire to the tent in the meantime, which we have reported to the Police as arson.

Carol visited a vulnerable resident alongside the police, who we received information about that is being scammed out of a lot of money – seemingly by 'friends'. The Police will follow this up with their bank and offer further support to the resident – as will we. This sits under Operation Signature – thank you to the resident who alerted us to this.

A vulnerable resident contacted us with concerns re a neighbour's behaviour. We advised and assured them that there was nothing amiss and everything was ok. They were happy with our reassurance and thanked us for our time.

Clubs and groups

Our Dungeons and Dragons club is up and running with a core of 5 young people attending!! This is self running now with 2 volunteers acting as Dungeon Masters. This is every other Tuesday at Macklins from 4pm – 5.30pm.

ASB

There have been further fires on the Brooks by the 'beach' area on the river and also at the gun emplacement on Park Mound. We continue to monitor the areas and have also found a lot of litter at both locations. We have a lovely lady who helps litter pick the gun emplacement and also a water bailiff who keeps an eye on the Brooks as part of the angling society.

We received some information regarding a dog allegedly being kept in a shed. We signposted to the RSPCA.

We've received a query regarding a vehicle being left on a jack by some Saxon Weald garages. We've advised the complainant to contact Saxon Weald as it's their land.

Further queries regarding the flags that are still in situ. We have however noticed there are only a few remaining.

We have been involved in a 3-way neighbour dispute over land ownership. This is a civil matter, and all parties have been advised of this. We've also invited them all to attend mediation. The situation continues and we will monitor.

We were advised of a drone flying over a vineyard in Nutbourne. This was deemed to be suspicious behaviour, and the incident has been reported to Police. We met with the vineyard and also advised them we would continue to include the area on our patrols.

We were asked about a vehicle using a disabled bay, without a blue badge. This particular bay does not have a TRO (Traffic Regulation Order) on it so there is no enforcement available unfortunately....

We received a call re some anti-social driving, and the complainant identified the driver. We knew who it was so went for a chat and there are two sides to every story.....

A parent spoke to us outside school to see what could be done around a neighbour smoking cannabis and the smell coming in. We gave words of advice and hopefully signposted to a resolution.

Projects

We haven't forgotten about the Dungeons and Dragons club for adults to tie in with the current one at Macklins for young people – we've just been super busy but expect to work on it soon.

We're also looking to set up a dog behaviourist event in the village with a local dog behaviourist.

We have arranged for 4 x summer fun sports sessions on the rec every Tuesday in August. This will from 11am – 1pm. This is free and open to everybody. Check our socials for further information.

Alongside this we would like to get a pump track on the rec for a day in the holidays. Parish Council is in agreement, and we are currently sourcing funding for this and confirming a date.

Fly-Tipping/Littering/Graffiti/Hazards

We reported a fly tipped sofa to our cleansing team for removal at Swan Court.

We continue to patrol the RSPB Brooks area where fires have been set. We feed any info into WSFRS and also the Police. People quite often say – 'there's a fire on the Brooks' and we tell them they must call 999!! WSFRS have been out to this site to reports of fires.

We assisted a resident in reporting an overgrown footpath from Rivermead to the Brooks.

We've had a report of someone saying there are rats in their garden due to their neighbour feeding seagulls.... we've advised them to contact Environmental Health.

We reported the overgrown hedge on the northwestern corner of the roundabout of the Cousins Way roundabout. This path has become much smaller over the years making it impossible for parents/carers to use that path with their child alongside them. Highways have said they are aware and are working with the hedge owner to get this resolved once the bird nesting season is over.

We've received reports of the Catholic Church site on Church Place. We've been in contact with Planning Compliance to ensure they are doing all they need to, to keep the site secure, which they are. We also monitor the area for signs of ASB.

We've reported the broken Swan Corner road name sign for repair.

We've also had reports of broken lights along the cinder path by the train station.... once the days are shorter, we can establish which ones aren't working and report them accordingly!!

A resident in a mobility scooter came to see us at the village market to complain about the overgrown vegetation along the cinder path, which made it difficult for them to get through. I attended, took some photos and send them to Highways. The southern end of the path was very narrow due to this, so we hope to see this cut back soon.

A resident reported a huge bonfire remains on the east bank of the river Arun by Stopham Bridge. I went to take look and have reported this to our cleansing team. I will also be reporting it to the Environment Agency due to its proximity to the river.

We reported an overflowing bin in Barn House Lane alongside fly tipping next to the BHF charity bin in Lower St car park.

Reported various different bits of graffiti on traffic signs in the village to WSCC.

Other

We have engaged with a dog behaviourist on a walk to look at training.

Lottie then got bitten by a dog!! Not the one on the walk, but a few days later...

We continue to empty the parish bins at the rec and Masons Way in conjunction with Alan the weekend litter picker, whilst there is no groundsman in place, as well as doing visual playground inspections and updating notice boards for parish council 😊

We received a report of lots of Himalayan balsam in an area of Pulborough. This is a non-native invasive species which has various rules around it and its spread. We've contacted the environment agency for advice.

We continue to have lots of patrols and engagement with our PCSO and share relevant information.
