## #YouSaid - What matters to you

Through Neighbourhood Link, social media and local engagement events, we have listened and will be prioritising:

- **Anti-social behaviour and the misuse of off-road motorbikes & e-scooters in Thringstone, Greenhill and Agar Nook**

**We did** - Throughout the month of January beat officers have conducted numerous patrols in the highlighted areas, joint agency meetings and patch walks have been carried out and perpetrators of targeted anti social behaviour in the area of Agar Nook have been identified and issued disposals. A section 59 warning has been issued to a person caught riding a motorbike along the pavement in the Greenhill area.

- **Dangerous parking outside schools at drop off and pick up times in Hugglescote, Ellistown, Ibstock and Whitwick.**

**We did** - Beat officers have been conducting proactive school parking patrols in **Hugglescote, Whitwick, Ibstock and Ellistown**. During these patrols a number of parents have been issued words of advice around their manner of parking (parking on double yellow lines, parking in bus bays and parking on a junction causing an obstruction to view). Joint operations with NWLDC civil enforcement team have been carried out, with one ticket being issued at Whitwick St John The Baptist CE Primary School. Beat PCSOs have held meetings with school representatives to discuss ideas around improving school parking.

- **Vehicles speeding in Hugglescote, Thringstone, Ibstock and Heather.**

**We did** - During the month two speeding operations have been conducted in the areas of Thringstone, Ibstock, Ellistown and Whitwick, with one TOR issued and two drivers given words of advice around speeding. Issues around speeding in the community discussed at two Parish Council meetings, Ellistown and Heather.

## #WeDid - What we are doing

### Partnership Working

PCSO 6650 met with the Headteacher of Hugglescote Primary School to discuss ongoing school parking issues .

We are always looking at ways to strengthen our partnership working, including a joint partner agency approach. This may involve drop in sessions for parents and carers, as well as the possibility of future beat surgeries at the school.



# #WeDid - What we are doing

## Increased Patrols

Officers from both the Bardon Beat Team and Response Teams have increased late-night and early-morning patrols in Ibstock. This follows reports of suspicious activity involving individuals in the area.

These patrols are preventative measures to provide reassurance and maintain community safety. We encourage residents to remain vigilant and report any concerns or suspicious behaviour



## Speed Checks

Officers from the Bardon Beat Team have conducted speed checks in Whitwick in line with our beat priorities and concerns raised to us by members of the public.

We focused on Hall Lane, during the time we were there the maximum speed recorded was 35 MPH in the 30 MPH zone

We will continue to conduct these types of operations across the Beat area in line with our current



## SORN Vehicles

Over the past couple of weeks officers have come across a number of vehicles parked on public roads, of which are registered as SORN.

Vehicles with a SORN (Statutory Off Road Notification) are not legally allowed to be parked on a public road or highway.

If your vehicle is SORN, it must be kept on private land (driveway, garage or private parking). Parking it on the street could lead to fines or seizure of vehicle. (like the vehicle in the photo)
