Nuisance E-Scooters

Operation Resolve officers were out in Nuneaton town centre in February, tackling anti-social behaviour, when they came across a group of youths treating the town centre like a racetrack. This was causing concern to members of the public and we won't tolerate any behaviour that puts others at risk. The two E-scooters shown were seized from individuals in the group, for having no insurance. It is not possible to get insurance for E-Scooters to be ridden on public roads/land, so they can only be used on private land without breaking the law. **E-scooters will be seized.** If you have any concerns about anti-social behaviour in your area, please report it so we can take appropriate action.



Visit to Weddington School

In February, PC Ben Rowton and PCSO Megan Warren from Nuneaton East SNT, visited Weddington Primary School and Little Blossoms Day Nursery. They gave a talk to the children about 'People Who Help Us', including what to do if there is an emergency and career paths in the police, to the reception children. The children also got to do the fun part – they saw the police car up close, heard the sirens, tried on our hats and coats and used our torches. Some even got to sit in the driver's seat to try it out.

BEDWORTH SNT NEWS

Bedworth Man Convicted of 41 Shop Thefts

A man suspected of 34.3% of the thefts at Bedworth Tesco, has been found guilty of 41 counts of shop theft from three different shops in the town. On Wednesday 28 January he was given a 40-week prison sentence. He also received a three-year Criminal Behaviour Order preventing him from entering Tesco and other shops he had targeted, and from wearing face coverings in any of Bedworth town centre's shops. This will come into force when he finishes his prison sentence, then, if breached, it can lead to a prison sentence of up to five years.

Criminal Behaviour Orders are an effective tool to target persistent reoffending, particularly for crimes like shop theft. The Tesco supermarket in Bedworth is in a hotspot area for **Operation Resolve** and covered by a plan for crime reduction. **Over a six-week trial period, a 50% reduction in crime was recorded.**

Bedworth East Safer Neighbourhood Team have been out distributing leaflets around the area to some of our elderly residents, to remind them of the danger around opening the door to anybody you do not know.



Cannabis Factory Found

At the end of January, officers responded to a report of a house burglary in progress; however, upon arrival, they discovered a cannabis factory. Cannabis factories pose significant dangers to both occupants and the wider community, largely due to unsafe modifications made to buildings. One of the biggest risks comes from modifications to electrical circuits at the property. Criminals often divert electricity directly from the mains to avoid detection, overloading circuits and removing safety devices. This greatly increases the risk of electrical fires and electric shock, not just within the property but in neighbouring homes. Thankfully, the electrics in this property, were made safe to prevent overloading and any further risks. **Please report any property that is suspected of being a Cannabis Factory.** Things to look for at a property are: A strong smell of cannabis, curtains always closed, signs of condensation, heat, no frost on roof, or random visitors maybe at night, carrying bags. Other names commonly used for cannabis are: Weed, Ganja, Hash, Spliff, Doobie or Green.
