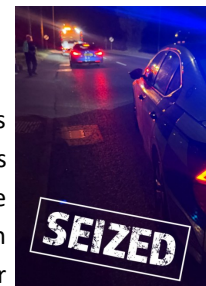

Motorbikes and quad bikes are being used in an anti-social manner around the green areas at Wykin Park	Patrols have been increased in the area and we've noted a decrease in reporting last month. Patrols will continue.
Vehicles are being used in an anti-social manner in Morrisons car park, Normandy Way. They are wheel-spinning and doing 'doughnuts' causing alarm to members of the public	Patrols have been increased in the area and we've noted a decrease in reporting last month. Patrols will continue.
Youths are causing anti-social behaviour on Clarendon Park which involves drinking and cannabis use	PC Emily and PCSO Josh were out patrolling known anti-social behaviour (ASB) hotspot areas, including Clarendon Park in Hinckley and Wood Street Park in Earl Shilton, following concerns and reports received from local residents. Our officers regularly carry out patrols in these areas to provide reassurance, deter ASB, and engage with the community. If you see them out and about, please don't hesitate to stop and say hello.

News

Last month we received dozens of calls from across the force area of a large scale car meet. Several calls reported street racing, drifting, dangerous driving and anti-social behaviour. Luckily, intelligence told us they were coming and SC's Sarah and Tom cut short their Sunday evening at home to kit up and hit the road. Reports were received in South Wigston, Blaby, Grove Park, Markfield, Wykin and Castle Donnington amongst others. Many vehicles were seized across the whole Operation for their manner of driving under S.59 of the Police Reform Act, and over 100 caught on Dashcams, whom should be expecting something in the post very soon. Roads Policing Officers continued to disrupt the car meets and take action as the large convoy travelled up the county and into Derbyshire who took over the operation. A huge thank you to those who called in and provided us with information.



Officers from the Hinckley and Burbage Beat Teams, alongside the Rural Crime Team, worked in partnership with Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council and the Environment Agency to assist with a large-scale illegal waste tipping incident. During the operation, a pickup truck and a JCB were recovered from the site under local authority powers, as they are suspected of being linked to waste crime. Illegal waste dumping can have a significant impact on our communities, countryside, and environment. We remain committed to working with our partner agencies to tackle those responsible and protect our local area. Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council is appealing for information in relation to this incident. If

Last month we highlighted an increase in burglaries and vehicle thefts across the Hinckley area, a thorough investigation was launched by our Neighbourhood Priority Team, supported by local officers. As a result of this work, four people were arrested in connection with the offending. Following extensive enquiries, two individuals have now been charged with more than 40 offences relating to 27 separate crimes committed across the Hinckley area. The two defendants appeared at Leicester Magistrates' Court and have been remanded in custody until the end of September. This is a significant result and I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Neighbourhood Priority Team, the local officers who supported the investigation, and the victims and witnesses whose information and cooperation were invaluable in bringing these offenders before the courts. Further enforcement activity will continue as we identify and pursue any additional offenders linked to this crime series.
