Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
Anti Social Behaviour	For full update see below.
Burglary	We have carried out proactive patrols to deter burglary and identify suspicious activity. In addition, we have held local beat surgeries, where members of the public can speak directly with Officers and access home security information and guidance.
Road Safety	We have been conducting regular patrols to improve road safety across the area, including stopping vehicles where offences have been identified. Officers have taken action in relation to issues such as speeding, mobile phone use and other road traffic offences as well as engaging with drivers to offer advice and promote safer driving.

News

Your local NH22 Beat Team has been out on proactive ASB (Anti-Social Behaviour) patrols over recent days, focusing on key areas of concern within the community. Particular attention has been given to an unoccupied care home on Hinckley Road in Leicester Forest East, ensuring the site remains secure and deter any potential anti-social behaviour or trespassing. We'll continue to monitor the location closely and work to prevent any issues before they occur. If you notice anything suspicious or have concerns in the area, please report it via 101 or online. In an emergency, always call 999.



We want to take a moment to reassure residents that your local beat team has been actively carrying out targeted patrols at Kirby Muxloe Parish Hall car park in response to concerns around suspected drug-related activity. Over recent weeks, officers and PCSOs have been conducting high-visibility in the area. These patrols are taking place at varying times of day and evening to deter offending behaviour and provide reassurance to the community. We have also been engaging with local residents and gathering information to support ongoing enquiries. We appreciate the concerns raised and our presence will continue. We are working closely with partner agencies to address any issues identified. Your support is vital in helping us keep the area safe. If you witness any suspicious activity, please report it .
