Appeal following theft



Your Eastbourne Neighbourhood Policing Team are appealing for information or assistance with identifying those involved following reports of a theft from a property along Hartington Place in Eastbourne.

The theft occurred on Saturday 27th September 2025 around 0115am where a large number (80) of Hydrangea flowers where stolen.

Appeal following road traffic collision

We are investigating a collision in Sevenoaks Road at the weekend, can you help?



The crash at the junction with Willingdon Drove involved a grey Vauxhall Vivaro and a grey Toyota C-HR ICON, at about 4.10pm on Saturday 27 September.

The driver of the Toyota, a 56-year-old local man, was extracted from his vehicle and was taken to hospital with his injuries.

The driver of the Vauxhall Vivaro did not remain at the scene.

We are investigating the circumstances, and witnesses or anyone with CCTV, doorbell, or dashcam footage in the area is asked to come forward. Information can be reported to Sussex Police online, quoting serial 987 of 27/09.
