What matters to you

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid.

Please see our beat priorities below from October to December 2024.

Priority 1: Anti-social behaviour in Moira – in particular Moira Furnace and Moira Miners Welfare Club

You said: Anti-social behaviour is causing you concern, particularly at Moira Furnace and Moira Miners Welfare Club.

What we have been doing: Targeted foot patrols of the area and regular beat surgeries held at the Furnace. Whilst we will robustly deal with those who break the law, we will also seek to engage with the drug users to understand what factors are driving them to this lifestyle and what interventions we can offer. Officers work alongside partner agencies to ensure the best service provider is in place to try and mitigate risk and open drug use.

Priority 2: Speeding

You said: Speeding vehicles are causing concern in areas across the beat.

What we have been doing: . The local community have raised speeding vehicles as a primary concern therefore regular speeding initiatives will be taking place across concerning areas on the beat and positive and proportionate action will be taken against those committing road traffic offences.

Priority 3: Drug Dealing – Albert Village

You said: Drug dealing in the car park of Albert Village park is a concern

What we have been doing: . Drug dealing is a primary concern therefore regular patrols will be taking place and positive and proportionate action will be taken against those committing offences.

What we have done #YouSaidWeDid

Community “meet the team events” were held in Moira and Measham and Donisthorpe, these events were well attended and thank you to everyone that came to see us. These events are a good opportunity to meet the beat team and ask any questions or raise concerns you may have. Please see below for community engagement events being held in October.

Officers attended Parish Council Meetings at Measham and Oakthorpe.

In line with our beat priorities officers conducted speed enforcement checks in Donisthorpe and The speed check took place on Acresford Road, Donisthorpe where a total of 57 vehicles were checked and 4 were found to be exceeding the speed limit.

The second location was Main Street, Swepstone where a total of 25 vehicles were checked and none were found to be exceeding the speed limit.

These checks are conducted as we recognise that speeding vehicles are one of the main concerns to residents. We will use these results to support applications to our road safety enforcement van deployment.

Thank you to the motorists that were travelling within the speed limit. Future speeding checks have been arranged for October.

Officers patrolled regular anti-social behaviour hot spots in line with their beat priorities.
