


# Charnwood East Newsletter

### We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following,

### What matters to you

### • Priority 1 - What you have said:

You have told us that anti-social behaviour (ASB) is a concern in your community, particularly involving the use of quad bikes and groups of rowdy youths gathering in parks and recreational areas.

#### Action taken

In response, we are increasing patrols in identified hotspots to deter this behaviour and provide reassurance to the public. We are also actively gathering intelligence to identify those responsible and take appropriate action.

• Priority 2 -

#### What you have said:

#### The community has also stated that speeding and parking issues are a concern at various locations throughout the Charnwood East area.

#### Action taken

Road safety remains a key concern raised by members of our community, particularly in relation to speeding and parking near schools. In response, we recently conducted a speed enforcement operation on Seagrave Road in Thrussington, targeting areas identified through community feedback and local intelligence. Static patrols have also been deployed at a location raised near the traffic lights to monitor driver behaviour and provide a visible deterrent. Further speed operations are planned, and work will continue to address the issues highlighted as a concern.

• Priority 3 -

#### What you have said:

Retail theft has been identified as a growing concern within the beat, with several stores being repeatedly targeted.

#### Action taken

In response, we are working with local retailers and the investigating officers to gather intelligence and build a clearer picture of the individuals involved. Our efforts are focused on identifying offenders and supporting businesses in preventing further incidents.

# The Beat Team News

Everyday your local beat team are conducting marked Police car patrols through the villages of Charnwood East. These villages are Syston, Thurmaston, Thrussington, East Goscote, Ratcliffe on the Wreake, Barkby, Barbky Thorpe, Beeby, Rearsby, Hamilton Lea, Queniborough, South Croxton and Thorpebury in the Limes.

On 23/06, PCSO 6098 conducted a beat engagement at East Goscote Village hall, where concerns and issues were raised by local residents. These concerns will be progressed by the beat team.

Officers from the local beat team conducted a Speed OP on Seagrave Road in Thrussington. They checked 35 vehicles and none of them were recorded over the speed limit of 30mph.





#### Crime prevention advcie:

Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity without delay and if you feel a crime is in progress then call 999 and take this time to review your own security.

Check your lock barrels  $\frac{1}{2}$ , if they do not have a 3 star  $\dot{x}$ ,  $\dot{x}$ ,  $\dot{x}$  rating, which are anti-snap security cylinder which provide the best protection against known cylinder attacks methods, then you could and should considered replacing/upgrading them.

Look at having a security light fitted, alongside good quality CCTV and ensure that windows and doors are left locked and secure and do not leave valuables on display - this can include empty boxes of that new PS5, ipad or similar.

Alongside this check how accessible your rear garden is - fix that lock on the gate, replace that fence panel - also a brilliant deterrent is some defensive planting  $\square$  around the perimeter of rear gardens.


