Newsletter Update – Now Quarterly

To make sure our updates are meaningful, concise, and reflective of the important work carried out across the ward, the Faraday Ward Newsletter will now be issued every three months, rather than monthly. This allows us to share more comprehensive updates, highlight emerging priorities, and recognise the outstanding work being done across all policing teams.

Operational Activity – Last 3 Months

Across all policing teams on the Faraday Ward, the last quarter has been incredibly productive, with strong results that reflect our shared commitment to tackling crime, safeguarding residents, and responding to community concerns. Over the past three months, officers have:

Conducted 183 stop and searches

Made 121 arrests

Issued 4 Community Protection Warnings

These results demonstrate the continued hard work, visibility, and proactive effort of officers across the ward. Every positive outcome - every arrest, every safeguard, every disruption - helps build safer streets and stronger trust within our communities.

Why Reporting Matters

We want to emphasise how vital it is that the public continue to report incidents or suspicions to us. Reporting ensures:

Your Safer Neighbourhood Team is aware of ongoing local issues.

Problems are flagged Met-wide, enabling wider intelligence development.

We can target patrols, identify hotspots, and problem-solve effectively.

No piece of information is too small, and every report contributes to the overall picture of safety on the ward.
