Priorities and what we have done #yousaidwedid

Priority: Local Police are aiming to reduce burglaries around the Loughborough East beat.

Action taken: There has been a slight rise in residential and commercial burglaries towards the end of 2024.

The beat team will be looking to reduce these with the use of high visibility patrols in targeted areas. We will look to liaise with the community in those affected areas to provide crime prevention advice and discuss security measures.

Update: Since the beat team have had burglaries as a priority, work has been undertaken to show a presence in the areas affected by these offences. This work will continue and work will be done to reduce the burglary offences committed in the area, dealing with those involved robustly. The beat team are happy to state that there has been a reduction in burglaries of 27.3% in the last month.

Priority: Police aim to tackle different elements of vehicles crime such as theft, TWOC and ASB caused by vehicles.

Action taken: Police aim to tackle vehicle crime by the use of dedicated patrols, both overt and covert in effort to reduce crime use of ASB with vehicles, disruption tactics on a wider scale using specialist officers.

Theft and associated offences will be targeted by pursuing reasonable lines of enquiry to assist identify and prosecute offenders in a timely manner. There have been 2x arrests made this month relating to Theft of Motor vehicles - the investigations continue.

Community engagement continues within the Beat and a specific Police operation is in place to tackle vehicle crime in the area

Dedicated patrols remain ongoing, at times with support from our specialist colleagues (traffic and dog handling) to specifically target the areas of concern around vehicle crime. These will be published on our Facebook page to update the public that these take place.

Update: At the time of writing, the last 28 days has seen a reduction of Theft from Motor Vehicles by 80% and Theft of Motor Vehicles has also reduced by 50%. This continues to be a priority for the beat team and work will be ongoing to reduce these offences further.

Priority: Police are developing and targeting people within the area that are drug dealing, exploiting vulnerable people by cuckooing addresses and causing anti-social behaviour from this type of crime.

Action taken: Drug dealing and exploitation of vulnerable people remains a priority for the beat team.

We continue to gather intelligence from the community, providing a robust response by executing search warrants and proactively looking to stop those we believe to be dealing drugs, applying any necessary closures order to stop the criminality and protect the public.

There are currently 6 active Closure Orders relating to addresses linked to vulnerability and County Lines drug dealing. There are a number of other addresses in the pipeline as we are proactively looking to disrupt those drug lines running through the community through such measures as Closure Orders and warrants.

Officers have been focusing attention on the Steeple Row area of Loughborough in relation to drug taking/dealing and street drinking. There have been a number of people detained, stop checked and arrested by officers in relation to drug possession and other linked offences. Investigations are ongoing and this will continue to be monitored. Officers will be updating the public on the work ongoing in that area. A Problem Management Plan has been implemented for that area and the beat team continue to patrol, with continued support from our specialist colleagues.

Update: The beat team continue to conduct work to disrupt county lines, working on future closure orders for other addresses and visiting those for compliance checks that already have closure orders in place. The beat team have executed a number of warrants at addresses that cause us the most harm - aiming to tackle drug lines that run through Loughborough, with positive results.

On **Friday 5th September**, PCSO 6185 and PCSO 6938 from the Loughborough Town beat team, attended the Falcon Centre recovery week football tournament. Whilst we were there, we also volunteered for a quick and easy test of Hepatitis C and we encourage others to do the same. That week was about celebrating people in recovery, proving that with the right support, determination and community, it's possible to come through the other side and achieve amazing things. The players showed not only great football skills, but incredible strength and hope for the future.



On **Saturday 13th September**, PCSO 6053 conducted a street consultation within the flats of Barnsdale Close. She gave out Crime Stoppers leaflets to all of the residents along with reassurance. There has been ongoing issues at this location with one flat in particular that is causing anti-social behaviour and drug activity. A Partial Closure Order was issued on this address by the beat team and further work will be ongoing.

On **Saturday 13th September**, PC 1041, PC 1343, PCSO 6185 and PCSO 6053 attended the Summer Fete at the Altogether Place. It was lovely to catch up with the local residents, answer questions and enjoy the fun and games.

On **Saturday 26th September**, PCSO 6053 conducted a street consultation at Staveley Court. Crimestoppers leaflets were delivered to each address and residents who answered had the opportunity to discuss any issues. Reassurance and support was provided to those who raised concerns. Thank you to those who came forward with information regarding suspected drug activity along the canal and alleyway. Please be assured that patrols will continue as we work to address the issue.
