CORBY UPDATES



Tackling motorbike theft

Corby's Neighbourhood Policing Operation Pacify team has purchased more than 150 security locks thanks to funding from the National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC). The team successfully secured £4,000 from the NPCC's Opal unit, which was set up in 2019 to focus on serious organised acquisitive crime that has a detrimental impact on the quality of life for others. Two events were held in Corby in September where the team distributed security devices.

Operation Pacify

Three years ago, the Corby Neighbourhood Policing Team launched a dedicated operation to clamp down on motorcycle nuisance and its associated anti-social behaviour in the town. Operation Pacify was set up in response to concerns from businesses and residents, whose lives had been blighted by motorcycles being ridden recklessly and dangerously in public spaces as well as on the roads. Since its introduction, and mainly thanks to community intelligence, the team has seized motorcycles and prosecuted riders for various traffic and vehicle crime offences. Community intelligence has been key to the success of the on-going campaign, and the team is appealing to people to continue to provide information, including sightings, dash-cam, doorbell and mobile phone footage to help identify offenders. Anyone with information about motorcycles being ridden illegally in their area can email the Operation Pacify team directly at operation.pacify@northants.pnn.police.uk and PC Crabb will get back to you when on duty. Have a question?

Northamptonshire residents are being invited to put their questions on crime and policing to Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Danielle Stone and Chief Constable Ivan Balhatchet at an online public meeting next month. The event will take place between 6.30pm and 8pm on Tuesday, October 21, and will be live streamed on both the Commissioner's and the Northamptonshire Police Facebook pages www.facebook.com/NorthantsOPFCC www.facebook.com/northantspolice.

For those that don't have a Facebook account, the event will also be live streamed on Northamptonshire Police's YouTube, where you do not require an account to view. The link to the YouTube page will be shared closer to the event date. Questions about any policing or community safety issue are welcomed – potentially covering subjects such as neighbourhood policing, violence against women and girls, retail crime and town centre safety, road safety or funding. Questions can be sent now on email - chiefschat@northants.police.uk.

Names won't be read out during the broadcast or shared online. Questions can also be sent anonymously using an email link that will go live 14 days before the broadcast. And questions can also be asked live during the broadcast through the Facebook chat. Danielle and Ivan will answer as many questions as they can in the time available.

Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage**. They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In August 2025, there were 298 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here [Northamptonshire Police Operation Snap](#).

Anyone who submits footage via Operation Snap can find out the outcome of their submission by following the link on their confirmation email which will take them to a monthly update.
