Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Fern Spellman who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of Police officers and Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Incidents of a public interest from the last week: -

ALCESTER

Theft / ASB / Common Assault and Suspicious Circumstances. We have received about 10 calls this week regards the same male who is responsible for offences in the area. Many of those incidents relate to shoplifting offences where he has also been abusive to staff and members of the public. He has previously been arrested on suspicion of offences that have occurred on our

Suspicious Circumstances. Store, Alcester. Known shoplifters have been into the store but as they knew they were being watched and / or challenged by staff they have left without stealing any items. Not the same male described in first entry. Thursday 10th and Friday 11th September.

Assault and Theft. The Leys. Male has approached delivery driver and has tried to get into the van. The offender has assaulted the delivery driver and stolen item from the front of the van (not a parcel). Speed Checks

After receiving complaints of noisy and speeding motorbikes on the A46 from residents of OVERSLEY, Alcester SNT carried out speed checks on the A46 from OVERSLEY towards STRATFORD (in both directions) this was carried out both in the morning and again later in the day.

Despite the 2 x prominent positions of the Officer, and no doubt the flashing headlights of other road users, offences were still witnessed and the offenders will be notified in due course.

We appreciate that this part of the A46 is wide and, when appropriate, a suitable place to overtake but excessive acceleration, especially coming off the OVERSLEY roundabout, is unnecessarily noisy especially from the bikes who are in convoy with their friends - Enjoy your drive/ride but please watch your speed and travel your own journey, don't blindly follow your friends, the gap that they are aiming for might not be big enough for 2 and a lot of bikes were breaching the solid white lines at the right turn lane under the bridge.

In the interest of fairness - It's worth noting that the worst offender on this particular sunny, Sunday was a car and that lime green FOCUS should note that your speed can be recorded as you are accelerating away from the obvious speed camera on the bridge – hence the -83 mph.
