#YouSaid What matters to you - Priorities

Priority 1

Dangerous and illegal use of vehicles around the Western Ward continue to be reported and raised as concerns by local residents. Speeding, E-bikes and E-Scooters and dangerous parking outside Primary Schools have all been highlighted.

Actions

The beat team have continued to target areas where this type of issue is most prevalent

Priority 2

Retail crime continues to be a problem for our shops across the Western ward which is causing staff to feel unsafe whilst at work.

Actions

We continue to maintain a good working relationship and open communication on sharing information to tackle the persistent offenders bring them to justice.

Priority 3

The community in the area of Styon Road, Kemp Road and Lamem Road tell us that youths are regularly causing Anti-Social Behaviour in and around the grassed Play area. Motorcycle gatherings causing excessive noise, Vandalism/damage to Property, targeting of a vulnerable residents and incidents of animal cruelty have all been reported.

Actions

High visibility patrols on dedicated days and times throughout the month to identify perpetrators.



A discreet Police operation in Styon Road took place on 2nd April in order to identify the perpetrators of this behaviour. During the operation a large Off-road Scrambler motorcycle was seized removing it from the streets and protecting the community. Since then no further reports of motorcycle ASB have been received from Styon Road, Lamem Road and Kemp Road. The team will continue to monitor the situation and speak to local residents.

- **Off Road motorbike seized from a male after it was seen riding on the road on Bateman Road and the male was reported for various traffic offences.**
- **April was successful with 4 high powered E-bikes being seized by officers, preventing them from being used again on our streets.**
- **A Speeding operation was conducted on Hinckley Road outside Western Park.**
- **Op Zigzag was conducted during April with many schools on the western ward being visited and parents parking on the ZigZag lines targeted.**
- **Recovery of a high-powered e bike on New Parks Boulevard from a 15-year-old.**



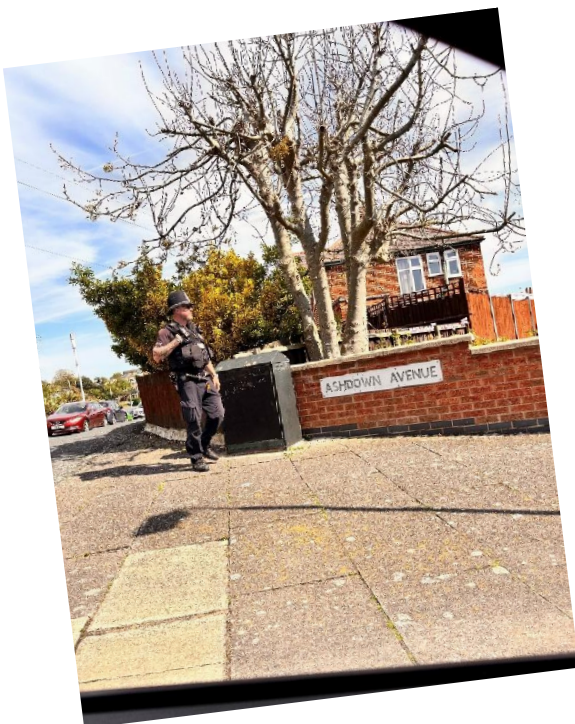


- A male offender targeting one particular store is currently being sort for arrest.
- **Regular Patrols of shops on the Western Ward.**

- A communication group setup by local shops continues to thrive with new stores joining during April. The group share information to help protect themselves and pass information to local police officers.
- **A prolific female shoplifter has been arrested for a number of offences and is due to appear at Leicester Magistrates Court on 11th May. She has bail conditions in order to protect the shops from further offending.**



- Patrols completed on Sandhurst Road and Ashdown Avenue following complaints about parking.
- **Patrols of Liberty Road after Kids have been reportedly playing in the road. #StaySafe.**
