## #YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following;

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

*You said:* Issues raised relate to general anti-social behaviour, but in particular youths throwing items at passing vehicles in the area.

What we are going to do: Dedicated patrols have been put in place for the area. The beat team are continuing to tackle anti-social behaviour in the area. We continue to manage this concern via a Problem Management Plan, and are working with our partners in respect of this matter. This is in relation to reports of youths with face coverings throwing eggs and other items at passing vehicles. We have had a reduction in offences, and hope to see it continue to decrease.

#### **Priority 2: Road Safety**

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, Road Safety has been highlighted to be a local concern for our Beat. As such we have re-introduced this as a priority for 2025 based on your voice.

What we are going to do: Throughout this first quarter of 2025 we will again focus on Road Safety issues as a Beat Priority. Whilst there are many strands to this priority we will look to cover as many angles as we can. PCSOs have been out and about conducting speeding checks in the areas of Braunstone Avenue, Gooding Avenue and Folville Rise. We will continue to carry out these checks—if you have any concerns about speeding in a specific area, please do let us know. Multiple vehicles have been seized by our response colleagues for driving with no insurance, along with people being arrested for related offences.

#### **Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)**

You Said: You continue to tell us that drug dealing and usage at addresses across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is still an ongoing concern and problem that you want us to keep as a priority.

What we are going to do: This priority was retained due to our community still reporting this as one of their main priorities and concerns. We have had some positive results—two Section 8 Drug warrants were conducted on Bennett Walk, with one person being arrested and investigated for drug offences. There were a further two Section 8 Drug warrants conducted on Raymond Road last week. This resulted in two cannabis grows being located and one person located and arrested. We look forward to continue working with our communities and partners in identifying those persons and addresses who cause harm to our communities through Drugs.

March has been another very busy month for the local beat team;

- With assistance from our colleagues in the Neighbourhood Priority Team, we have conducted two warrants in relation to drug use/ possession/dealing on the estate. One person was arrested, and the investigation is continuing.
- From intelligence gathering, we have located 2 cannabis grows on Raymond Road. A substantial amount of cannabis plants were seized from both addresses. Cannabis grows are dangerous and can crop up in any residential area. They can pose a serious risk of fire and seriously damage the property. If you see anything suspicious or think there is a cannabis grow in a property, please report this to us.
- PC Martin attended The Grove Community Hub for their International Womens' Day event. She was joined by Sharon from Violence Against Women and Girls. It was a brilliant turn out, with girls from Years 6 and 7 attending from local schools.
- Road Safety remains a priority on the beat.
  'tales of the Road' booklets have been handed
