Community and Business Engagement. Ongoing from the results of the Safer summer campaign, focusing on business and community engagement across the beat to establish any issues and concerns raised.	Our team, PC Meg, PC Jason, PC Ross and PC Jamie have worked together to charge a male with 75 offences in one go! Most of these relate to shop thefts and breaches of Criminal Behaviour Orders (CBOs) across multiple stores, including repeat targeting of the Grove Triangle and Fosse Park area. A CBO is a court-issued order designed to tackle persistent offending. It can ban individuals from certain areas or behaviors and breaching it is a criminal offence. Thanks to strong partnership work and persistent investigation, this prolific offender has now been remanded into custody and is facing the consequences. Retail crime isn't low-level it's organised, repeat offending, and we're tackling it head-on.

The shuffling of PCSO's will see PCSO 6592 Danny move to the Fosse Villages and take over PCSO 6028 Ryan as he will be moving on to the NH19 (Braunstone Town & Thorpe Astley) beat. Along with this news, we also see a new face joining the role of a PCSO of whom we wish to introduce you to. Please welcome PCSO 6120 Dan (pictured in the middle) who will be taking over from PCSO 6592 Danny on the NH20 beat.



Admittedly, getting the two Dan's mixed up is expected...It's already caused a bit of confusion in the station! Please make sure to stop us, have a chat, take some photos and ask any burning questions you may have for us.

PCSO Sarah and PC Jen have been visiting Narborough Nursery to see all the children and to give out some road safety goodies. The children were very pleased to see us and the police car. Let us know if you want us to do any visits to schools or nurseries in the Littlethorpe, Narborough, Enderby area, and we will try and accommodate where we can.

A number of ECINS reports were created which is our anti-social behaviour monitoring system. One report was around fireworks and youths on the park in Narborough, we spoke to the caller and advised we are awaiting the CCTV to identify the offenders. The Council offices in Narborough have had issues with youths, playing music and screaming, patrols were completed and the youths were not causing any issues at the time but advised to respect the surrounding neighbours, we will be monitoring this. A report of ASB in Queens Court Enderby was received of youths setting fires and smoking Cannabis. The caller was visited by Officers, no fire were noted at the time of attendance. We have contacted EMH to make them aware of this incident and will continue to monitor.
