Safety at Christmas
At this time of year, lots of people head into our towns to enjoy festive events such as Christmas markets, light shows, religious events and more. We love these events, but we know they could be attractive targets for those who look to do us harm. That's why

we increase police presence around many events - both in uniform and plain-clothed. Here are some tips to help you stay safe, both at events and on the journey there and back. Stay alert, look out for each other and trust your instincts. If you see or hear something that does not feel right, report it straight away, don't wait for someone else to do it. You can report your concerns



to police, security staff at venues or events, or anonymously online at gov.uk/ACT. In an emergency call 999.

Business Crime week in November. Operation Resolve officers working with Trading Standards, seized 176 illegal vapes and 208 packets of illegal cigarettes. These were unsafe, unregulated and

not up to UK standards. Getting them out of local shops helped to protect our communities and support the honest businesses doing things the right way. We'll keep working hard with our partners to stub out illegal tobacco and vape trade across Nuneaton.

Conviction For Assault

A man assaulted and racially abused a shop worker during the protest activity

that took place in Nuneaton Town Centre in August this year. He was identified, arrested, and convicted thanks to strong public support and tireless investigative work. Following an appeal for information that we shared on our social media channels, informative

leads from the public helped us locate and identify him, then he was arrested. He pleaded guilty to various offences when faced with clear video footage and has been fined nearly £2,000. We could not have done this without your



support - so thanks to everyone who played a part.

PCs Lily Patterson and Ben Rowton from Nuneaton East SNT were driving down the A5 one evening in November, making sure everyone was behaving. Then one driver decided to overtake them at speed, heading towards the Higham Lane

junction. When they stopped him, he was polite enough to tell them he had a drink not long before driving. When tested he was over the limit so, he was arrested to be charged the next morning when he was sober - but with a hangover.



One evening, Nuneaton SNT were patrolling local bonfire and firework displays, to ensure that everyone was having a good time and keeping safe. They had to give some stern words to groups of youths setting off fireworks in the town centre - not so safe. They saw some very impressive firework displays though!

Hate Crime Awareness Week

In November, PCSO Davis, supported by other PCSO colleagues from Nuneaton SNT have been delivering The Sophie

Lancaster training package to Year 6 students across 4 Primary schools in Nuneaton. This particular package promotes – "Acceptance and Respect for All" so, is very appropriate during Hate Crime Awareness Week.



Arrests for Burglary

In November, a woman and a teenage girl were charged following a burglary in Nuneaton. Dorina Marin, aged 31 and a 17-year-old girl who cannot be named for legal reasons, both of Romford, Essex, were charged with six counts of distraction burglary and one count of attempted distraction burglary. Two of the offences were alleged to have taken place in Attleborough in October. The five other

offences took place in the West Midlands area. Officers worked on a joint investigation with West Midlands Police to secure the charges. Both were remanded to appear at Coventry Magistrates' Court.

In October, Bedworth SNT were in Bedworth Town Centre talking with members of the public about their concerns and giving out crime prevention advice, as well as personal



attack alarms and bike locks. We were accompanied by the Police and Crime Commissioner, Philip Seccombe, Local Councillors and EQUIP as part of Hate Crime Awareness Week.

EQUIP are a charity providing support, advice and training to people across Warwickshire to combat discrimination.

Also in October, PCSO Tracey Hall arranged a morning visit to meet the new intake at Keresley Newlands Primary School. The children enjoyed doing some colouring with Tracey and were very interested in the work that we do, so lots wanted to be police officers when they leave school.



Dangerous Motorbikes Seized

While on patrol in the Bedworth area in October, SNT officers noticed very strangely adapted electric bikes weaving in and out of traffic at dangerous speeds and putting everyone at risk. They drove through Bailey Park as children played, but although we cut them off on the other side, they escaped while shouting abuse at officers. However, one of the males had been spoken to earlier in the day by the same officer and although he had given the wrong

surname, we found him on the system very quickly. On a visit to his home address, the boy was ordered to return home by his parents, together with his friends, and made to apologise.

Their dangerous bikes were then seized and will be destroyed.
