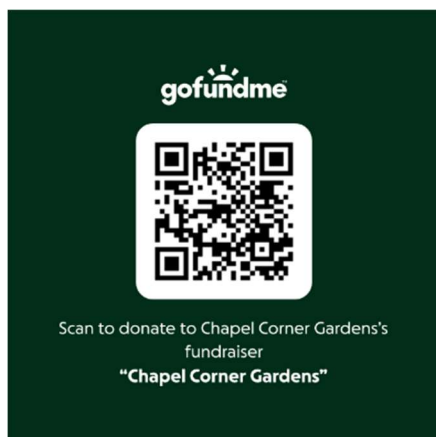
Chapel Corner Gardens – Trinity United Reformed Church

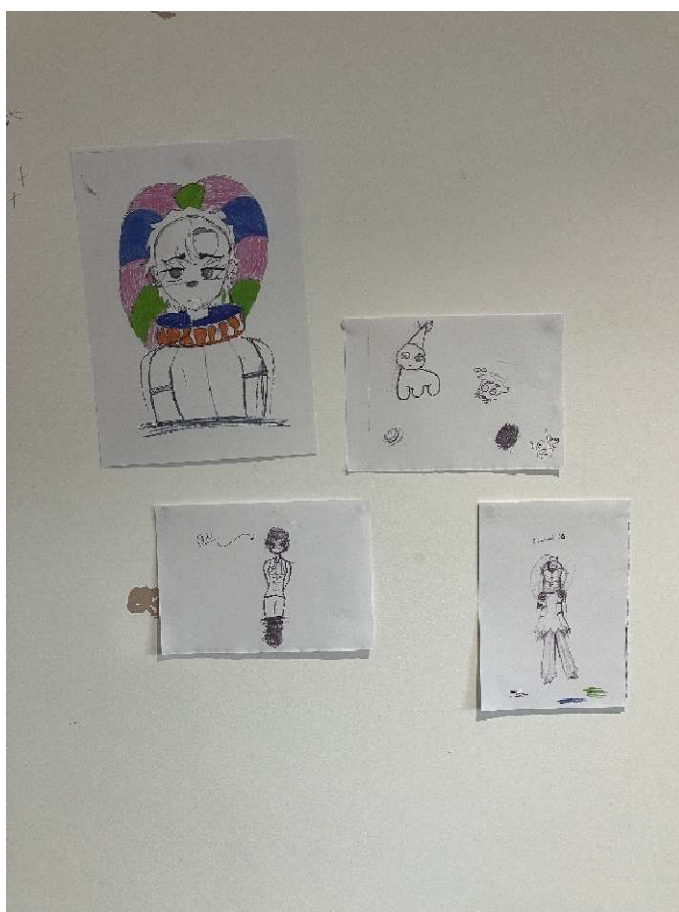
Youth Boxing Programme Update

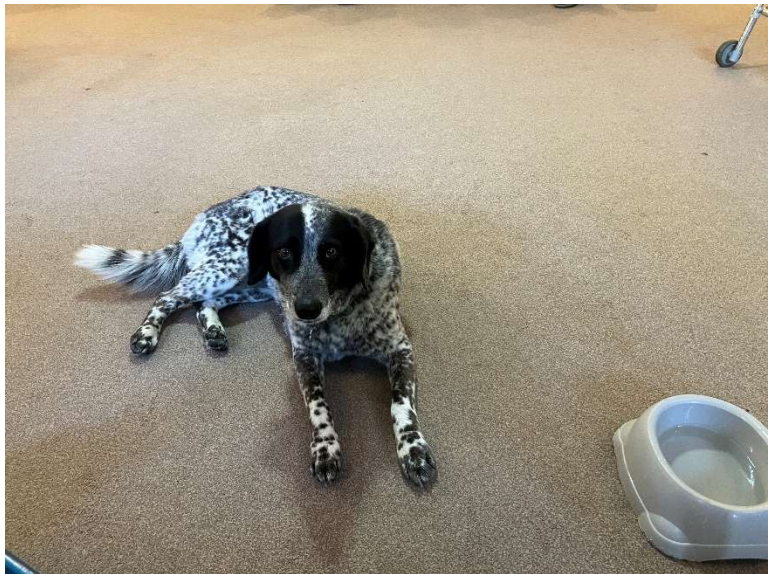

This initiative is delivered in partnership with PDCCA and is open to those living with dementia, their carers, and anyone seeking support or signposting to relevant services.

Whilst Out on Patrol

Vehicle collision with a house



Whilst out on patrol on Tuesday 26th May we came across an incident in Barnfield, where the handbrake on a vehicle had failed and it had rolled down hill into a property leaving damage to the brickwork. Fire crews from Storrington had arrived quickly on scene as well as engineers from the gas company as the vehicle had collided where the gas supply connected to the property. Neighbouring properties were evacuated, and it was heart warming to see how the residents of Barnfield came together in very hot temperatures making sure those who had been evacuated had shade and water provided. We checked on residents and offered assistance.

Fly Tipping & Litter



On Thursday 7th May Ross joined the 2nd Billingshurst Guides for an evening of litter picking around Station Road and Lower Station Road recreation grounds. Thank you to the guides and their leaders for inviting us to join them and for helping to keep Billingshurst clean.



Over the last 3 months one young person from Billingshurst, who has been completing his bronze Duke of Edinburgh award, has carried out voluntary litter picks in the parish alongside members of his family. On Tuesday 26th May we joined him for his final litter pick. For two hours in the balmy heat we cleaned Station Road Gardens, the footpath to Natts Lane, Lower Station Road recreation ground and back up passed the railway station. We collected two large sacks of rubbish between us!



Whilst out on patrol during half term week we found a large plastic container filled with rubbish in Wooddale Lane. This was reported to HDC for removal. We also carried out litter picks whilst patrolling Jubilee Fields. It was disappointing to find so many empty bread bags around the lake.

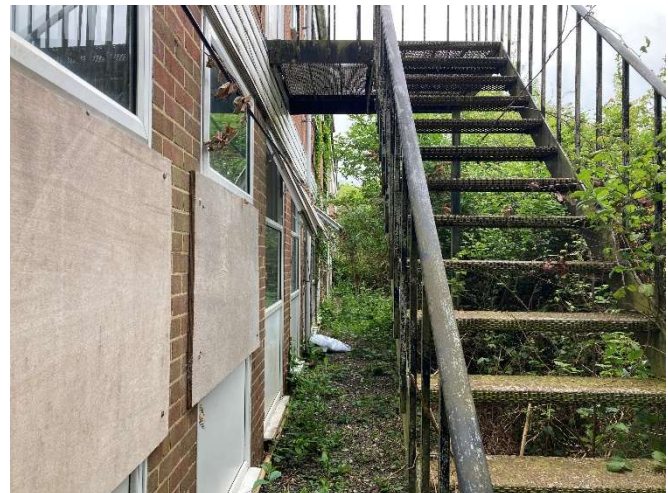
Following a post on one of the Billingshurst Facebook pages about a large amount of litter and broken glass being found in woodland adjacent to Jubilee Fields over the late May bank holiday weekend we attended the area and spent over an hour clearing away broken glass, bear cans and food wrappers. It was disappointing to also find 3 separate areas where fires had been started.



Prohibited Street Trading

May has seen us continue to liaise with our colleagues in licencing about a street trader who should not be trading in prohibited streets within the parish.

Anti-Social Behaviour/Damage





We were contacted by a concerned resident regarding young people gaining access to an empty commercial premises in Brookers Road. We attended the area and ascertained where access was being gained. After establishing ownership of the building, we made contact with the owners who were quick to secure the building. Thank you to them for their prompt action.

Once again, we have also received reports of young people gaining access to the old Barclays bank building in the High Street and we have contacted the owners to better secure the property.

Answer: Electric scooters are illegal to use in public areas in Sussex

for a non-emergency, or call **999** in an emergency.



During May we have seen an increase in young people using electric scooters on the roads and footpaths in Billingshurst. E-scooters are illegal to use in public areas in Sussex. We have also witnessed some unsafe riding/manoeuvres and have made Sussex Police aware.

If you know someone who rides an e-scooter, they must only do so on private land with the landowner's permission.

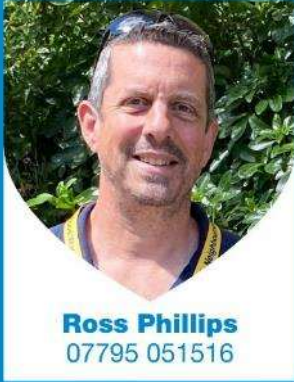

Based within the community, your Neighbourhood Wardens work alongside partner agencies to improve the quality of life for everyone and promote community cohesion and resilience. The Wardens undertake a number of activities, ranging from enforcement to community development.

Neighbourhood Wardens can help the community in the following ways:

- Meet the needs of the community and improve the quality of life for the residents, through engagement, promotion and support.
- Develop projects that benefit the local residents, to tackle community safety issues and promote inclusivity.
- Promote community cohesion, resilience and solidarity to encourage and empower communities to resolve issues.

- Support vulnerable members of the community with activities, advice, welfare checks and signposting.
- Engage with residents daily to get to know their local community and become a trusted friend to offer advice and guidance.
- Offer education and advice when required, before taking enforcement action.
- Contribute to the delivery of the Community Safety Partnership plan by working with other agencies.
- Provide a highly visible and reassuring uniformed patrolling presence.
- Provide an effective eyes and ears service aimed at reducing the fear of crime and improving quality of life.
- Work alongside the Police and submit reports regarding drug use, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour.
