

You said

WEAVER and CUDDINGTON

You Said: you said speed was a concern on NORLEY ROAD, THE SPINNEY and IRIS RISE.

We Did: we did together with community speed watch volunteers, we monitored/observed all concerned locations. Numerous drivers were recorded exceeding the posted speed limits. As a result, speed warning letters have been issued to all registered drivers identified as exceeding the speed limits.

You Said: you said speeding was a concern around schools.

We Did: In response to previous concerns about school parking, parking patrol has been conducted around WEAVERHAM HIGH SCHOOL engaging directly with drivers to address issues. Future collaborative approach to ensure safety, addressing parking violations will be made.



Community Speedwatch

CSW initiative is designed to help manage and reduced speeding in our area. By using speed detection equipment at the roadside, volunteers like you can play a crucial role in making our streets safer.

How It Works -

- Volunteers are trained and supported by the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).
- You'll use a speed gun to monitor traffic speeds.
- Vehicle details of those exceeding the speed limit are recorded.
- Drivers of speeding vehicles receive warning letters.

Schools

This month children at Weaverham Academy Primary School participated in a discussion about personal safety, including the topic of stranger danger. The session was conducted with the Weaver and Cuddington Beat Team, emphasizing the importance of staying safe and being aware of potential dangers from strangers.

WEAVER and CUDDINTON beat team visited SANDIWAY BROWNIES this month participating in a bleep test followed by a discussion around personal safety.

TRUCAM

Speed enforcement was conducted on WEAVERHAM ROAD in which 6 activations were recorded and processed for our central ticket office to progress further.

PARKING

NORTHWICH NORTH Beat Team conducted a parking patrol around WEAVERHAM churches, acting as mediators and listening to the concerns of all parties involved. While we understand the community's parking issues, no offences were reported during this patrol. We have also engaged with the faith congregation to explore long-term solutions to the ongoing parking challenges in the area. STREET OF THE WEEK

Street of a Week has been conducted around KENDRICK CLOSE, FARM CLOSE WEAVERHAM discussing with resident their community issues/concerns.

Engagement made with residents through face-to-face surveys to discuss their community issues and concerns. For those who were unavailable, we provided a survey leaflet with a QR code for convenient completion via mobile camera. If you would like your Street to be part of our 'Street Of The Week' initiative please let us know. This programme gives residents the opportunity to discuss various issues, including ASB, Parking, Speeding, Visibility, Drugs and more. We look forward to your participation and feedback.

SAFEGUARDING

The Herbert Protocol is a safeguarding measure designed to help locate and protect vulnerable individuals, particularly those with dementia, in the event they go missing. It involves gathering detailed personal information, including medical history, a photograph, and details of places the person may be familiar with, to assist the police and community in finding them quickly and safely.

This proactive approach can be crucial in ensuring the safety and well being of those living with dementia.

If you know someone who could benefit from having a Herbert Protocol form completed, especially if they are living with dementia or another condition that makes them vulnerable to going missing, contact your PCSO for assistance to complete -
