Beat buses

Beat bus surgeries are a useful way to speak to local officers in person, raise any issues or concerns, and receive crime prevention advice. We advertise beat buses online here in advance, so you can see where we will be. Officers have various resources and leaflets on lots of different topics you may be concerned about such as burglary and anti-social behaviour.

Public spaces protection orders

Kettering NPT officers working in partnership with safety officers from North community Northamptonshire Council, are tackling street drinking and anti-social behaviour in the town centre. Public spaces protection orders (PSPO) are made under the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. They aim to support the local authority and Police in tackling ASB such as the consumption of alcohol on the street, anti-social parking or foul or abusive language for example. Signs have been placed around the area to warn and deter.

Tobacco seizure

Police and Trading Standards officers have found illicit tobacco worth more than £250,000 in a self-storage unit in Kettering. Officers from Kettering Neighbourhood Policing and North Team (NPT) Northamptonshire Council's **Trading** Standards carried out the joint visit on Friday, August 8. The enforcement was the result of an investigation which began after officers received information which suggested large amounts of illicit tobacco were being stored within a container at the storage facility. Although no-one was present at the unit, the team found a total of 708 packs of hand rolling tobacco and 325,080 individual cigarettes (16,254 packets) worth an estimated £258,000.

Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage.** They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In August 2025, there were 298 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here <u>Northamptonshire Police</u> Operation Snap.

Anyone who submits footage via Operation Snap can find out the outcome of their submission by following the link on their confirmation email which will take them to a monthly update.
