Undate on Priorities

As you may be aware, the priorities over the last 3 months for Bakewell Safer Neighbourhood Team across all the areas we cover has been the following:

- · Burglaries of dwelling's and outbuildings.
- · Parking offences.
- Road Safety issues.

Following continued consultation last month with communities and reviews of your concerns, passed to us through Derbyshire Talking surveys and at community engagement events, we will be continuing to look at these priorities mentioned above.

We will therefore work to minimise these issues and address your concerns over the coming months, working with partner agencies where required. We will, as always, post updates regarding our work on our social media channels

There will be a consultation with communities in regard to our next quarterly set of priorities towards the end of June. If you wish to have your say and tell us what your concerns are then please complete the Derbyshire Talking survey.

Running this month from the 19th to 26th will be Operation Sceptre, an operation where the police will be focussing on the dangers of knives and targeting areas of the community to raise awareness during this time. Throughout the period, officers from the Safer Neighbourhood Team will be engaging with the local communities at public engagement events, businesses with heavy footfall and your local school.

At the community engagement events, there will a Knife Amnesty Bin available for you to dispose of any unwanted knives. These dates will sent out on our SNT Facebook page and Derbyshire Alert.

Following reports pf doorstep sellers we are issuing the following safety advice;

- Arrange appointments for callers to come back when you have a friend or relative with you
- Always ask for ID and check it carefully, photograph it to check out with their employer / police
- If in Doubt KEEP THEM OUT

Burglaries

During the month of April there has been a few burglaries reported whereby residential properties and outbuilding have been targeted. With this mind, the team asks you to remain vigilant, remember your security and please report suspicious activity to on the below contact methods.

Community Speed Watch

Community Speed Watch is a national initiative ran by volunteers in communities where speeding and road safety is of a concern. The aim is to monitor and record the speed and registration of speeding vehicles through communities in an attempt to improve driver behaviour, by encouraging drivers to slow down and there by preventing collisions. The activity allows the police to send letter of advice to the registered keeper of the vehicle warning them of the driver's behaviour and dissatisfaction of the community through which the vehicle travelled.
