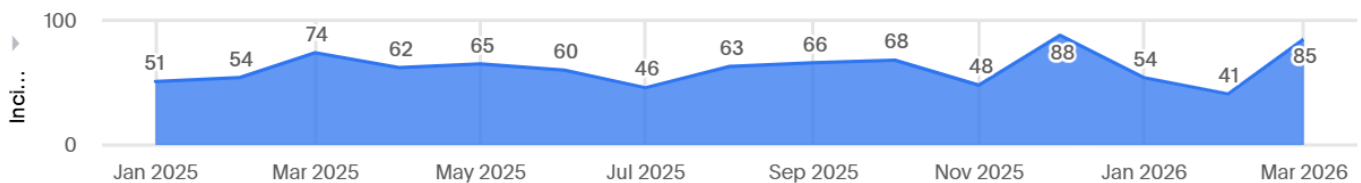

Ward Priorities

1- Theft and robbery

Action taken- Identify areas on the ward where parcel theft is an issue, social media awareness with posters highlighting 3 step protection and how to keep parcels safe. We also worked with the local Concierges on identification of suspects and residents' awareness. Vis & Plain clothes patrols across the ward, targeting Pegler square, Weigall road and Cator Park.

Results – No personal robbery recorded for the first quarter, significant reduction on shoplifting.

2- Anti-social behavior

Action taken- High Vis & Plain clothes patrols across the ward, targeting Cator Park children Playground, Sutcliffe Park, Ignatius Sancho Road and Pegler Square.

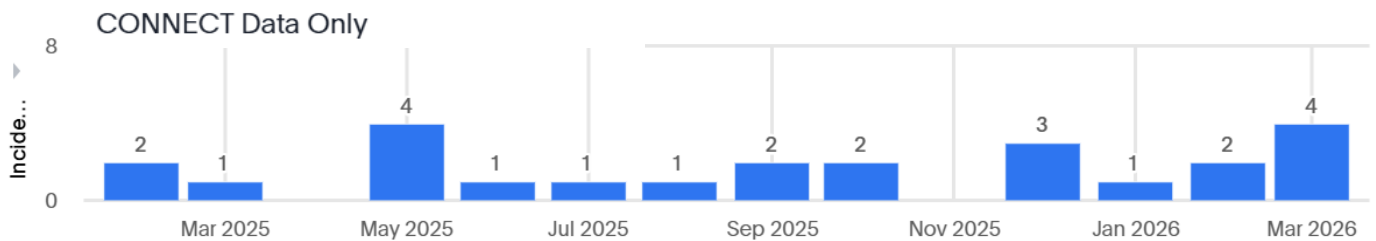
Results – 5 suspects detained, 1 arrested, 2 positive stops for Class A Drugs.

3- Shoplifting

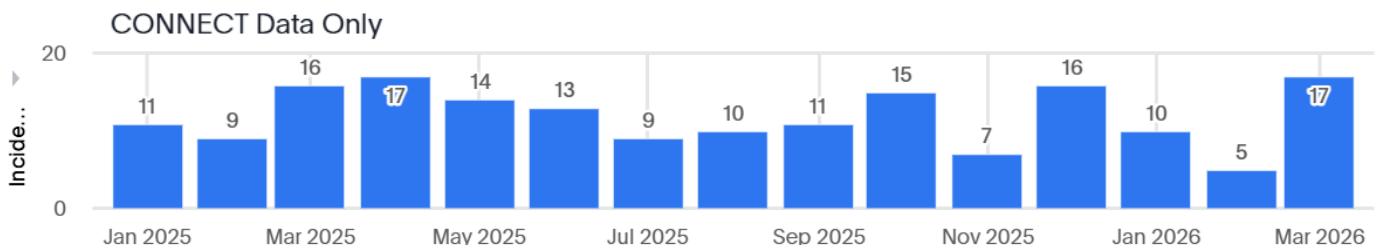
Action taken - High Vis & Plain clothes patrols across the ward, targeting Pegler Square shops and Aldi.

Results – 5 suspects detained and arrested, 4 charged for shoplifting offences.

Sexual Offences - Last 365 Days



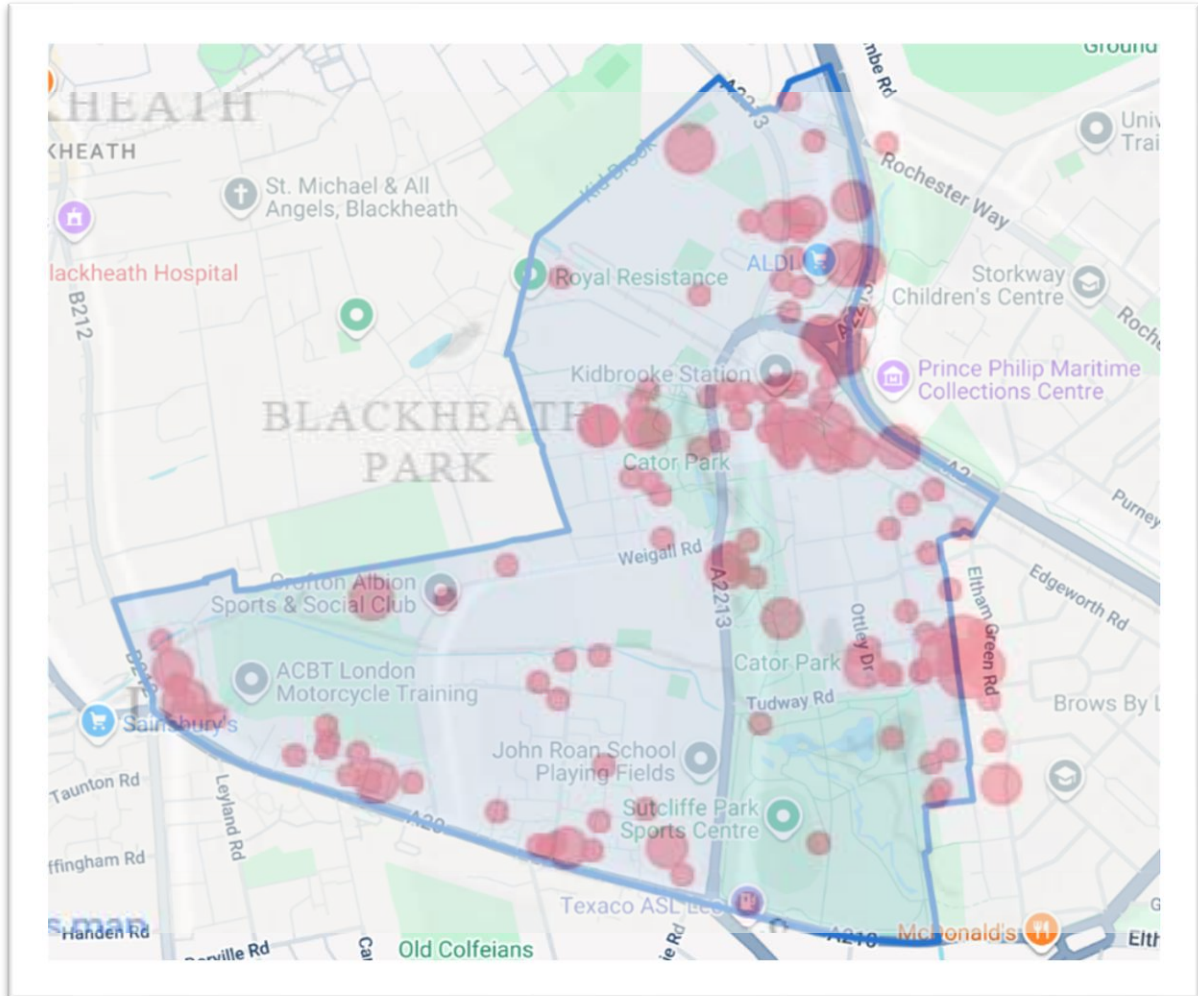
Theft and Handling - Last 365 Days

Good News Stories

Since January 2026, your Kidbrooke Village and Sutcliffe, Safer Neighbourhood Team have collectively achieved 14 Positive outcomes, for a variety of offences including Theft, Assault, Breach of Bail, Fraud, and Failure to Appear.

The SNT team have also been actively involved in tackling incidents of shoplifting, burglary and public order offences affecting businesses in Pegler Square and Kidbrooke Village.

January 2026, officers responded to a call made from YOHOME regarding a shoplifting and a potential report of a knife. SNT Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe fast deployed from the base, and Officers led a lengthy foot chase following the suspects. Officers detained the suspects within 7 minutes of the 999 call being made, with the support of the KIDBROOKE COMMUNITY HUB officer contingency. This follows an incident of attempted shoplifting at YOHOME in October whereby Officers detained a youth, gave strong words of advice and issued a banning letter on behalf of YOHOME.

In other news, SNT Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe has increased VAWG patrols around the ward at all times of the day, targeting isolated locations with past reports of incidents including the footpath behind ALDI and Sutcliffe Park. On 12 January 2026, PC 1478SE and PC 1716SE held a VAWG Walk & Talk with a local resident and representative from Southern Housing, to identify areas in the ward where women felt unsafe and to discuss proactive measures to implement moving forward.

In February The Team joined the fun with the Chinese New Year celebration at the Kidbrooke Community Hub, this event brought together vibrant culture and community interaction highlighting a variety of performances. The Team achieved 6 positive outcomes for shoplifting offences 1 stolen motorbike recovered. We dealt with numerous ASB issues around the ward and drug related offences.

In March The Team conducted three stop and searches positive for class A drugs, community resolutions were issued, one positive outcome for shoplifting offences and a charge.

This is still an ongoing issue that we take very seriously, and we will continue to target over the coming weeks by undertaking proactive high-visibility and plain clothes patrols.

Officers were deployed on Ramadan patrols all over Greenwich, reassuring communities around mosques and targeted areas.

Thank you to everyone that attended the **Violence against women and girls**, Walk and talk with Greenwich Community Safety Team to visit areas on Kidbrooke Village and Eltham Page wards.

We continue to explore proactive ways we can support and police the problematic areas highlighted to us on the day.

Residents have pointed out concerns on the footpath behind Aldi, the area is dense with greenery, young girls and woman have expressed feeling vulnerable when crossing the area.

The Team have contacted the landowner T F L, raising the issues and requesting a walk and meet with SNT, to discuss what can be done to improve lighting, visibility and safety.

We have approached Thomas Tallis school with the aim to do presentations on safety and awareness for pupils to ensure the young people in our community feel comfortable walking home at night and day.

Officers will continue to do regular patrols in the location.
