

Crypto Investment scams

Investment scammers stole more than £97 million of savers' cash in the first half of 2025, according to industry body UK Finance.

We have recently seen an increase in reports.

How it works?

The victim is contacted to invest in a fake crypto currency. The offenders will be very convincing and will provide you access to an online platform to monitor your investments, however it is all a scam, as when you ask to remove part of your investment, they will ask you to pay an additional fee in order to release either all or part of your money and will continue to request more fee's. Once the victim realises it is a scam, the criminals then break all contact.

If you are asked to pay money to release an investment, STOP and report it.

Lots of fake emails


At this time of year, criminals are even more active on the run up to Christmas.

Below are just three examples of such emails (received in the last hour by me). Two are offering free rewards if you complete a survey and the other states that you need to update your details otherwise risk losing you cloud storage.


Apart from being scams, all three though have one thing in common. They all request that you click on links.

If you receive an email with a link, it is highly likely to be a scam, **so do not click it.** However, if you are not certain, then do not Assume or Believe and Confirm by contacting the company on a telephone number that you either know or researched yourself.

Police Impersonation Scam – Courier fraud.

We have received reports of criminals calling residents in Tonbridge, Romney Marsh and Margate impersonating police officers.

Residents are being called and told:

- Their bank account has been compromised.
- Their card needs replacing A family member has been arrested.
- They must buy gold A courier will collect their card, cash, or gold.

These are scams. The police will never ask for your financial details over the phone or send someone to collect your card, cash, or valuables.
